Ownership dates for animals are as follows:January 1, 2024:Market Beef, Dairy cows, Dairy Goat milking doesApril 15, 2024:All SwineMay 1, 2024:All breeding beef, bucket calf, all meat goats, all novelty goats, all
Horse, all poultry, all rabbit and all sheep

The above dates are when all 4-H'ers with these projects must have the animals in their possession.

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Wabash County 4-H will be hosting a Goat Workshop on Saturday, March 9, 2024 from 10 am- 12 pm at the Wabash County Fairgrounds Livestock Barn located at 15039 Four H Lane, Mt. Carmel, IL 62863.

This is a hands-on experience for youth to learn about goat selection and how to get your goat project started. Topics such as early care, feed, facilities, health, and more will be covered. The main focus of this workshop will be on meat goats and dairy goats but information on pygmy goats can be provided. This workshop is open to all of Unit 25 (Edwards, Lawrence, Richland, Wabash & Wayne).

QAEC Training

For members enrolled in **horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats**:

This would be your first year in one of the above projects. If you are required to complete the YQCA, it will count for the QAEC—**you do NOT need to complete both.**

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @

web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/. NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. This certification is a one time certification and does not need to be redone every year.

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YQCA Training

Attention youth enrolled in **Beef, Dairy, Goats, Sheep, and Swine.** It is that time again to get certified in YQCA. For new members enrolled in these species this is a yearly certification you must complete by June 1, 2024 to exhibit

livestock at the 2024 Richland County Fair. There are two ways you can get certified, the first is an online course and second being a face-to-face training. If you pick the online course visit YQCAprogram.org and select the online course and pay \$12. If picking the faceto-face training also visit YQCAprogram.org and select inperson training and then find the date you are wanting to attend and register for it online. You must register for an

in-person training online and pay the \$3 there. If you have questions, please contact the Extension office for assistance.
