You will have the instructions and any forms that need to be returned to us. New this year, Cloverbuds are required to complete Fair Entry as well as regular members. The deadline to have all entries made and forms returned is May 31st.

If you exhibited a project at the 2023 Fair you have a premium check to pick up. This is completely different from your auction check that you received after the fair. Please have these picked up by May 1st.

You need to have this done by May 1, 2024 in order to show at this years fair. Illinois Extension Sheep and Goat Weigh In is Saturday May 4th at the Wayne County Fairgrounds. Please let us know your Weigh-In Information by Wednesday May 1, 2024. Before weighing in: we need to know the Sex of each animal you are weighing in, how many you are weighing in per child (4 is the max), their Scrappies Tag number (or other IDOA approved identification method).

Ownership Dates:

GOAT: Market Wethers and Does are to be born on or after October 1, 2023, owned by May 15, 2024
SHEEP: Market Wethers and Ewes: Ownership deadline is May 15, 2024. Lambed on or after January 1, 2024.

Weigh-In Procedures

Market animals (beef, goat, sheep and swine) must be tagged and/or weighed by Extension staff or their designee on the date designated for the specie you are showing. All weigh-ins will be held at the Wayne County Fairgrounds dates will be sent out 1 month in advance. Enter the fairgrounds from the south gate (Main Street) and exit using the north gate (Mt. Vernon Road). If you are not showing a market animal, please notify the extension office prior to the weigh-in so they know your attendance is not required. Notification to the office is required with the number of animals you are weighing or if you are not coming prior to the weigh-in date.

Rate Of Gain Contests

Any 4-H member with a market animal project may enter this class. The Rate of Gain contest is a voluntary class; however, if you choose to compete in the Rate of Gain contest the following requirements must be followed.

Each exhibitor will be allowed to enter the following in the Rate of Gain contest:

Market Lamb (ewe or wether) - may weigh up to 4 animals. Market Goat (doe or wether) - may weigh up to 4 animals.

All market animals must be weighed, and weight recorded, by Extension Staff on set dates. the final weigh in will be made on Sunday, July 7, 2024, at the fairgrounds. All market animals in the Rate of Gain contest will be ear tagged or tattooed at the initial weigh in. Weights of the animal will be calculated on average pounds gained per day.



What is Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)?

Illinois 4-H, requires all youth ages 8-18, enrolled in livestock projects
(Beef, Dairy, Goat, Sheep, Swine) to complete annual quality
assurance certification through the Youth for the Quality Care of
Animals (YQCA) program. YQCA is a national multi-species quality
assurance program. The goals of this program are to ensure safety
and wellbeing of animals produced by youth for showing 4-H projects,
ensure a safe food supply to consumers, enhance the future of the
livestock industry by educating youth on these very important issues
so they can become more informed producers and consumers in
agriculture and food industry, and offer livestock shows a valid,
national quality assurance certification for youth livestock
exhibitors.

When do I need to complete YQCA training?
YQCA Training will take place at 4-H Club Meetings. Youth MUST take
this training prior to making their county 4-H show entries. County
deadline is May 1 (Entries will NOT be approved unless training is
complete.) This does not apply to youth exhibiting animal or
veterinary science poster/display projects.

How do I complete the training and what is fee?

Youth have two options to be certified. You may attend a certification program hosted by the Extension Office at your Club Meeting (cost \$3) or you may complete the training online (cost \$12). Each club will be offering an in-person training opportunity.

Youth who choose to attend an in-person instructor-led training will need to register online through the YQCA website. Youth MUST preregister and pay online; no walk-in registrations or money can be taken the day of the training. Youth who do not take the in-person club meeting YQCA training will be required to turn in their certificate to the Extension Office by May 1. If you do not turn in your certificate you will not be able to show in the 2024 Fair.

Register before your next club meeting to make sure you can attend the class!

Dog and Horse Papers

If you plan to lease your animal, your completed lease agreement, with picture of both the right and left sides of the dog or horse must be turned into the extension office by June 1. The Lease Agreement can be downloaded from our website: go.illinois.edu/WayneCounty4-H or picked up at the extension office.

NEW for the 2024 FAIR

All Livestock Trailers will need to be parked in the designated Trailer
Parking Area or taken home.
Adequate space will be given for tack and feed storage. You WILL NOT REQUEST tack storage in pen counts. This will be assigned by Livestock Superintendents and 4-H Staff. More information will be coming in the June/July Fair Newsletter.

General Projects Show

How does this day work?

Members will be assigned a time for judging that will be released in early July. It is the 4-H members responsibility to pick up their project tags at the extension office the week before the 4-H show. When you show up for the General Project show you will want to show up 10 minutes before your assigned time with your project, entry tag attached to your project and project records in hand. Questions? Feel free to call us at the office!

Off Premise Form

Animals enrolled in the 4-H program are expected to be in the 4-H member's regular care from the animal project starting date until the conclusion of the 4-H show, at the county fair and/or state fair. If animals are housed someplace other than the 4-H member's residence, then an Off-Premise form needs to be on file at the Extension Office by June 1, 2024. The Off-Premise Form can be downloaded from our website: go.illinois.edu/WayneCounty4-H or picked up at the extension office.
