4-H Expansion and Review - Carrie Eldridge, 4-H Youth Development Educator asked the council members to complete the 4-H Expansion and Review survey. She provided an overview of how the 4-H team works to address some of our area's most pressing issues. She asked for feedback from the council and they agreed the program plan is in alignment with the community needs assessment.
