Illinois 4-H Club Excel Level Recognition Award

Any club enrolled with their local Extension Office by August 1st of the calendar year in which they are applying is eligible. The application should reflect the involvement of club members and leaders working together as a team toward the accomplishment of a common goal. The activities and projects must relate to the specific award category and must be completed from September 1st of the previous year to August 31st of the year in which the application is being completed. The award has three separate areas. A club may submit an application in one, two, or all three award areas. The award areas are:

- **Community Service** - Focus on your 4-H Club's work in service to/for others. Work should target what members have done as a group, not what individual members may have done on their own. Youth leadership in planning and implementing the work should be evident.
- **Leadership** - Focus on the development of the club members' leadership skills as a group. Overall, group leadership may focus on one of the following Teen Leadership roles – teaching, mentoring, planning, promoting, or advocating OR members may be enrolled in a group Leadership project, and all members learn a variety of skills throughout the year.
- **Project Learning** - Focus on the Club's program plan to help members learn about a specific project area. Only ONE project area may be highlighted in the award application. For award purposes, "project" is defined as those areas of enrollment listed in the Illinois 4-H Clover or as a county-offered project. Not all

members need to be enrolled in the project, but most should have gained knowledge about that project through the Club's educational activities. Youth should also have been involved in the planning and implementation of project learning.

4-H Club Officers have a big responsibility since they are representatives of the 4-H program in their Club, community, state, and nation. Outstanding Reporter Award

Club Reporters are asked to send reports and/or pictures to their local and 4-H newspapers and other media outlets to promote and share 4-H in their communities. When items are sent to the Extension Office, they are placed in the 4-H Newsletter. The reporter who submits the most reports to the news media and the Extension Office is recognized as an "Outstanding Reporter."

The Secretary Book is the official record of the Club's bylaws, member attendance, Club business, and all the Club's activities during the 4-H year. Each book is judged according to several criteria, including the completeness of each meeting's minutes.

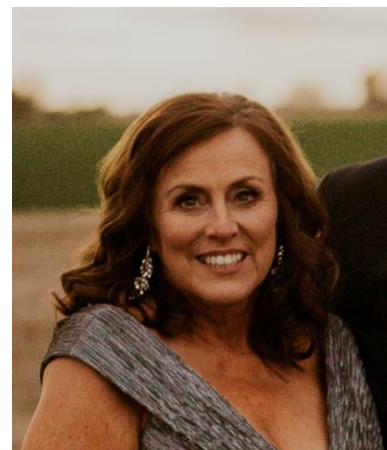
Recognition of 4-H Leadership

4-H I DARE YOU Leadership Award

The American Youth Foundation awards the *I Dare You Award* to recognize personal integrity, balanced living, and leadership potential. This award recognizes those who are ready to "dare" to achieve their highest potential and to influence others through lives of leadership and service. Each fall at the close of the 4-H Program year, Extension staff nominate one member who was at least 16 years old by September 1st of the previous year to receive this recognition. The winner receives a Certificate of Recognition from the American Youth Foundation, William H. Danforth's book, *I Dare You!* And is eligible to attend the American Youth Foundation's National Leadership Conference.

Individual Experience Level Recognition Award

Within the Individual Experience Level Recognition Award, there are four dimensions of experience:

Participation -Community Service – Leadership - Project Learning

Members are required to write a note explaining how they completed each experience marked, including what the event was, dates, etc. Among those four dimensions, there are categories for Club, county, multi-county, state and national experiences. To top it off, members can only count an activity once. They are not permitted to count any activity in multiple experience locations. The award levels and requirements are as follows:

1. Bronze Clover Award – Complete 1 experience in **each** of the four dimensions listed above.
2. Silver Clover Award – Complete 2 experiences in **each** of the four dimensions; at least 2 of those experiences must be at the County level or beyond.
3. Gold Clover Award – Complete 4 experiences in **each** of the four dimensions; at least 2 of those experiences must be **BEYOND** the County level.
4. Diamond Clover Award – Complete 6 or more experiences in **ONE** dimension; at least 4 of those experiences must be **BEYOND** the County level.
5. Emerald Clover Award - Complete 8 or more experiences in **ONE** dimension; at least 4 of those experiences must be **BEYOND** THE County level **PLUS at least 2** must be at the State or National level.
