### Master Showmanship

This event is open to any Wabash County 4-H livestock member that is between the ages of 14 and 18 as of September 1, 2021. The youth will be showing a beef cow, a sheep, and a pig. You will be judged on your showmanship skills. Youth will be required to find a fellow 4-Hmember to let them barrow their animal for this if you do not show one of the animals listed above. However, Megan can help guide you in the right direction if you need help. The winner will then advance to the IL State Fair where they will represent Wabash County!

Sign-up for this event will be Sunday, July 17th.

## **Important Reminders:**



Every 4-H'er will be required to attend FOUR 4-H meetings this year in order to show at the fair. This can be club meetings or workshops that the extension office hosts. Must have these meetings in by July 1!

## **Off-Premise Form**

In certain instances, members may keep their livestock on property other than their own. The member is required to submit a livestock Off-Premises Form to the Extension office for approval (including horses). As noted on the form, the 4-H member is responsible for the daily care and feeding of his or her animal project. This form must be submitted to the extension office by **June 1st, 2022**. ## Livestock Check-in

#### All Livestock must be on the grounds by 2 pm Sunday, July 17th. With Weigh in beginning at 2:30 pm.

#### The Check in Process will go as follows:

- We will start with Swine- exhibitors must be present to weigh in their pigs. We will be going down the rows of the swine barn. More direction to come day of.
- Once all the pigs are weighed-in we will move to sheep, then goats, and then steers.
- You will lead them to the show arena when instructed to do so.
- At the conclusion of the large livestock, we will check in the poultry and rabbits.

Once you have weighed in your animal you will find our table set up in the show arena.

Crop Sciences Research & Education Center, 4202 South 1st St., Savoy, IL 61874 Check-in and registration start at 8 a.m. The competition starts at 8:30 a.m. and will end by 1:30 p.m.

- The competition is open to high school students completing grades 9-12 in the spring of 2022. They will work in teams of 2 to 5 students led by an adult coach. Coaches can be FFA advisers, agriculture teachers, seed dealers, co-op employees, and others. No more than three teams per sponsoring organization (e.g. company, school, club).
- This will be an outdoor event.
- Meals: Lunch, beverages, and snacks will be provided.

#### Host families needed for the States 4-H International Exchange program

Host a youth from Japan or South Korea this summer, through States' 4-H International! Expand your family's cultural understanding, learn about new foods and customs, and possibly learn a new language, all while sharing your own. Your children will build lifelong friendships and will gain new perspectives on their own country, too! Families are needed for 3 weeks, July 23 through August 18 (tentative dates). Applications are accepted until all placements are made. There is no cost for this program. Students are matched with a host sibling by age, gender, and interests. Families hosting, must have a child between the ages of 12-18.

Host family selection is dependent on completion of an application and screening process, as well as student availability and personality compatibility.

Hosts without children may host an adult chaperone.
