Swine Weigh-in - Saturday, April 2, 8-9 a.m.



- ➡ Weigh-in for all barrows will be held from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. on Saturday, April 2 at the fairgrounds.
- ➡ All barrows to be shown in the 2022 Wayne County 4-H Fair must be tagged by extension staff.
- Ownership deadline for barrows is April 1, 2022.
- ➡ Up to 5 barrows may be tagged.
- Barrows weighing over 85 pounds will not be eligible for rate of gain.

OFF-PREMISE FORM

Animals enrolled in the 4-H program are expected to be in the 4-H member's regular care from the animal project starting date until the conclusion of the 4-H show, at the county fair and/or state fair. If animals are housed someplace other than the 4-H member's residence, then an Off-Premise form needs to be on file at the Extension Office by June 1, 2022.

DOG AND HORSE EXHIBITORS

Being a new 4-H member can be confusing, and we want our new members and parents to have a time to open up and feel comfortable asking questions.


