## Club Information

### State Fair Livestock Nominations

#### Market Wethers, Market Ewe Lambs, Meat Goat Wethers

- Self Nominate using through a nomination form with accompanying photos of lamb's ear with Scrapie tag number visible.
- Complete form between March 25 and May 15
- Forms will be emailed to all youth enrolled in the sheep project in ZSuite after March 1. They can also be picked up at any of the office.
- Forms must be signed by a 4-H staff member.

#### **Premiere Wether & Ewe Lambs**

- Animals showing in Premiere classes must be weighed and tattooed.
- All wethers and ewes must be lambed on or after January 1, 2024

#### **Premiere Barrows**

- Barrows eligible if farrowed on or after February 10, 2024
- Must be weighed & tattooed between February 10 and April 15.
- Pigs must be within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1lb/day of age.

Contact Extension to schedule a tattoo date if planning to nominate for Premiere shows.

## **Mercer County Goat Exhibitors**

As we gear up for the upcoming fair, we would like to inform all goat exhibitors of the essential arrangements for setting up the goat barn. Your participation and assistance are vital to ensure a smooth and successful event.

You will be notified of the specific date and time allocated for setting up the goat barn closer to the fair. Your presence and help during this period are required to facilitate the setup process effectively. In the event that you are unable to assist on the designated day of setup, it is your responsibility to arrange for a substitute to take you place.

Your cooperation and commitment to their endeavor is greatly appreciated. Together we can make this year's fair a memorable and enjoyable experience for all involved.

## Livestock Ethics Trainings

If you are showing Dogs, Cats, Horses, Rabbits, Poultry:

- You are required to complete Quality Assurance & Ethics
- Complete **once** in your 4-H career
- Training is free and found on ZSuite. Log-in to your account and click on the Clover Academy in your dashboard.
- Please complete by May 1.

#### If you are showing Beef, Dairy, Goats, Sheep, Swine:

- You are required to complete <u>YQCA</u>
- This training is required yearly
- Available online for \$12 here: <a href="https://yqcaprogram.org/">https://yqcaprogram.org/</a>

### **Upcoming in-person training:**

We will be holding an in-person YQCA training on **Monday, April 15** in the Milan office at 6 p.m. This training is \$3. The payment MUST be made online when you register. We cannot accept any payment in person. You must register in advance through the YQCA website—https:yqcaprogram.org. Registrations must be done by **April 11**.

## Horses

Horse ownership, lease and/or registration papers along with color photos of each side of the

horse are due to your local office by May 1. Those forms will be sent out to everyone enrolled in the horse project with fair books as soon as they arrive.

State Horse Show entries are due to Stephanie Hardy at the Illinois State Fair office by **June 1.** This is a hard deadline! They will not accept late entries. Copies of the ownership, lease and/or registration papers and photos must be included with the entries. Entry forms are found on the



Illinois State Fair website. \*Note that the website has not been updated with 2024 entry forms, yet.\*
