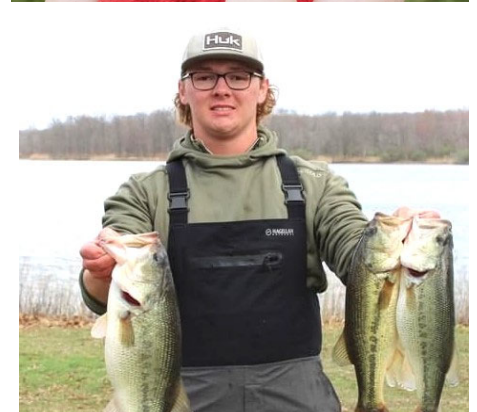

Online ethics certification required for cats, dogs, horses, rabbits and poultry

Deadline - Monday, June 3

First time animal exhibitors enrolled in cats, dogs, horses, rabbits and poultry need to complete QAEC. This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits.

Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification is a one time training for youth exhibiting projects in the following: cats, dogs, horses, poultry, and rabbits. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. Members who don't complete the certification by June 3 will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show.

The QAEC training can now be accessed in the Clover Academy section of the ZSuite Enrollment System.

- In-person trainings will be held at the 4-H Center. **4-H members must register and complete the pre-test before attending the in-person training.** Registration must be done online! Do not send Yolanda an email to sign you up.

REMEMBER - Youth will need to complete the Pre-Test before attending the training. Youth will need to complete the Post-Test before printing the certificate. **DO NOT SEND YOLANDA AN EMAIL TO SIGN YOUR 4-H MEMBER UP.**

The deadline to complete the training to be able to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H & Junior Fair is Monday, June 3! No exceptions to this rule.

If completing the training online, email Yolanda a copy of the certificate. If you need assistance, please contact Yolanda for help.

Leasing Animals

Leasing animals as 4-H projects is allowed. However, the following needs to be kept in mind: the animal should be cared for by the 4-H member, and prepped and ready for exhibit by the 4-H member. *If the 4-H member isn't able to care for the animal him or herself, then other projects should be considered*

Understanding 4-H Fair Entries vs Junior Fair Entries

ZSuites - <https://4h.zsuite.org/>

- ZSuites is the enrollment program used for 4-H families to enroll their youth in Shelby County 4-H.
- Members can only exhibit 4-H projects that they are enrolled in ZSuites by May 1.
- Adding projects into ZSuites - Log-in to ZSuites, click on the 4-H members profile. Click on the Clubs tab at the top and select and add projects.
- **All fair entries will be confirmed from Fair Entry to ZSuites. If you make a 4-H fair entry for a project that the member hasn't enrolled in ZSuites, then it will be removed from the Fair Entry program.**

4-H Fair Entries

Fair Entry - <https://go.illinois.edu/24Shelby4Hfair>

- Fair Entry is the program used to make 4-H fair entries. This system allows families to pick the individual classes, example: Hereford steer, Junior buck, Gilt, Woodworking 1, Cooking 101, etc.
- **The green pages in the fair book correspond to the 4-H show in Fair Entry.**
- The fair book will list the specific details for the project requirements. A 4-H member may only exhibit in **one** of the classes for a specified project area, Example: Cooking – you can only enroll in Cooking 101, 201, 301 or 401, not 101 and 201. **DO NOT ENTER MULTIPLE CLASSES IN A PROJECT AREA.** If you do, you will receive a call or email asking you to fix your entries.
- Only 4-H members enrolled in the Shooting Sports Club may exhibit in the Shooting Sports classes.
- This is very important - you may only exhibit 4-H projects that match to the projects in ZSuites!

Junior Fair Entries

- Youth may exhibit in any of the junior fair classes, excluding those that have specified dates such as steer weigh-in, horse photos submitted, etc. Example: if your youth likes to take photos, they could show those photos in the Junior Fair and not have photography as a 4-H project.
- Each youth exhibiting in the Junior Fair needs to complete an exhibitor card. One card per youth. If you have three youth in your family, you will need three entry cards.
- The Jr. Fair entry sheets are on yellow paper. The Jr. Fair entry forms correspond to the yellow pages in the fair book (pages 17-46).
- Each project area needs to have an entry form. Example: Woodworking and welding would go on separate forms.
- Cloverbuds are not eligible to exhibit in the Junior Fair.

Plan ahead so that you don't miss the deadline.

**You do not need to wait until June 3 to submit your entries. 4-H entries are already being submitted.
The deadline for fair entries is Monday, June 3. Late entries will not be accepted!**

Members enrolled in the Little Roots Gardening Program, may bring two projects from projects listed on page 69 of the fair book.

Cloverbud exhibitors will display their projects in the 4-H Center during the fair. Projects should be in place between 5-8 p.m. on Sunday, July 21. Little Roots gardening projects can be dropped off at the Produce Building on Sunday July 21 between 5-8 p.m. All projects can be picked up on Wednesday, July 23 from 9-10 p.m. or Thursday, July 24 between 8-8:30 a.m.

Cloverbuds will have an opportunity to Chit Chat with an older 4-H member about their projects on July 24 at 1 p.m. at the Darrell Gregg Pavilion.

This event isn't required but is a great experience learning to talk with others. Special awards will be given to those who participate.

Cloverbuds will need to pre-register by July 1 if they wish to participate in Chit Chat. Watch your email with updates in early June. ***Only those members who pre-register for Chit Chat will receive a special award.***

General Projects included in the Youth Livestock Auction

- A 4-H'er can auction only one general project exhibit.
- 4-H members must be present at the auction in order to participate.
- Up to 10 General Projects will be eligible to participate in the Auction. Project areas selected may include but not limited to: Interior Design, Photography, Visual Arts (various), Woodworking, and Welding.
- Members with eligible projects need to mark their projects at check-in if they would be interested in selling their project in the auction.
- Projects for the auction will be selected by a special committee.
- Selected projects will be tagged by 6 p.m. on Tuesday, July 23. It is the 4-H members responsibility to register their project and complete necessary paperwork by 10 a.m. on Wednesday, July 24 in the Fair Office.
- Projects will be sold and given to the buyer. If the project is being taken to the State Fair, ownership will take place by Friday, August 16.
- 2% will be taken out of all checks to cover the cost of photo and auction costs. **NO REFUNDS!!**

Shelby County 4-H Member Policy

Now is the time to look back at the 4-H year and confirm with your club leader(s) - "Have I met my county requirements in order to exhibit at the fair?"

If a 4-H member wishes to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H Fair and be eligible to receive premiums, the following items must be completed by the 4-H'er:

- 4-H'er must attend **three** of their own club meetings. College students must attend two of their own 4-H Club meetings.
- 4-H'er must present a talk or demonstration at their own club meeting. The talk or demonstration must pertain **to a 4-H project**. It doesn't have to be a project the 4-H'er is enrolled in.
- 4-H'er must participate in a county activity. Examples of a county activity include: 4-H Round-up, Winter Craft Day, 4-H Fire-Up, 4-H Week activities, Spring Cleanup at the fairgrounds, Spring Craft Day, 4-H project workshops, etc.

If you haven't met one or more of the requirements, talk with your club leader NOW for suggestions on what can be done to meet the requirements. This requirement also applies to all Cloverbud members. Contact Yolanda with any questions.
