## **Horse and Pony Ownership and Lease Papers**

Horse and pony lease and ownership papers are DUE in the Extension office by Thursday, May 1. Two pictures (each side) of horse to be shown or as a back-up horse must accompany lease/ownership papers.

If you are planning to show at the State Fair as well as the Shelby County 4-H & Jr. Fair, TWO sets of pictures must be turned in. The correct lease and ownership papers are available at the Extension office, on the Shelby County 4-H Website or by email. Contact Yolanda with any questions.

## Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

All 4-H members enrolled in beef, dairy cattle, goats, swine, and sheep are required to take YQCA training. This training is required to be taken each year. In-person training is \$3 and the On-line training is \$12. In-person training sessions are set up to be completed in approximately one hour. All training sessions will be held at the 4-H Center in Shelbyville. Families will need to register at the YQCA website, sign up for which training they would like to attend and pay the registration fee. *Youth will need to complete the Pre-Test before attending the training.* Youth will need to complete the Post-Test before printing the certificate.

## **General Projects included in the Youth Livestock Auction**

Wednesday, July 23 Information can be found in the fair book on page 132, here are highlights.

#### **Rules:**

- New for 2025 A 4-H'er can auction only one exhibit or an animal project in the Youth Livestock Auction but not both.
- 4-H members must be present for 4-H judging and at the auction to participate.
- Up to 10 General Projects will be eligible to participate in the Auction. Project areas selected may include but not limited to: Interior Design, Photography, Visual Arts (various), Woodworking, and Welding.
- Members with eligible projects need to mark their projects at checkin if they would be interested in selling their project in the auction.
- Projects for the auction will be selected by a special committee.
- Selected projects will be tagged by 6 p.m. on Tuesday, July 23. It is the 4-H members responsibility to register their project and complete necessary paperwork by 10 a.m. on Wednesday, July 24 in the Fair Office.
- Projects will be sold and given to the buyer. If the project is being taken to the State Fair, ownership will take place by Friday, August 15.

## 4-H Camp Scholarship Opportunities

There are two scholarship opportunities for Shelby County 4-H members who are planning to attend 4-H Camp this summer. Shelby County 4-H Federation offers a \$50 scholarship. 4-H members must complete the Federation scholarship form located on the website <a href="https://go.illinois.edu/FederationScholarshipApp">https://go.illinois.edu/FederationScholarshipApp</a>

Shelby Extension Foundation offers 4-H'ers a \$30 scholarship. Members can write a short essay about why they would like to attend 4-H Camp or may create a poster about why they are looking forward to going to 4-H Camp. Scholarships will be reimbursed after the 4-H member has attended camp.

## Cloverbud exhibitors

Cloverbud members must complete fair entries for projects they wish to display at the fair. Families will follow the Fair Entry Instructions for completing entries. Cloverbuds may display 2 projects. If bringing 1 project, select Cloverbud project 1. If bringing 2 projects, select Cloverbud project 1 and Cloverbud Project 2. Cloverbud Members enrolled in the Little Roots Gardening Program, may bring two projects from the project listing on page 74 of the fair book.

Cloverbud exhibitors will display their projects in the 4-H Center during the fair. Projects should be in place between 4-7 p.m. on Sunday, July 20. Little Roots gardening projects can be dropped off at the Produce Building on Sunday July 20 between 4-7 p.m. All projects can be picked up on Wednesday, July 23 from 8-9 p.m. or Thursday, July 24 between 8 a.m.

Cloverbuds will have an opportunity to Chit Chat with an older 4-H member about their projects on July 23 at 1 p.m. at the Darrell Gregg Pavilion. This event isn't required but is a great experience learning to talk with others. Special awards will be given to those who participate. Cloverbuds will need to pre-register by July 1 if they wish to participate in Chit Chat. Watch your email for a sign-up reminder in June. *Only those members who pre-register for Chit Chat will receive a special award*.

## **Understanding 4-H Fair Entries vs Junior Fair Entries**

#### ZSuites - https://4h.zsuite.org/

- ZSuites is the enrollment program used for 4-H families to enroll their youth in Shelby County 4-H.
- Members can only exhibit 4-H projects that they are enrolled in ZSuites by May 1.
- Adding projects into ZSuites Log-in to ZSuites, click on the 4-H members profile. Click on the Clubs tab at the top and select and add projects.
- All fair entries will be confirmed from Fair Entry to ZSuites. If you make a 4-H fair entry for a project that the member hasn't enrolled in ZSuites, then it will be removed from the Fair Entry program.

#### 4-H Fair Entries

#### Fair Entry - <a href="https://go.illinois.edu/25Shelby4Hfair">https://go.illinois.edu/25Shelby4Hfair</a>

- Fair Entry is the program used to make 4-H fair entries. This system allows families to pick the individual classes, example: Hereford steer, Junior buck, Gilt, Woodworking 1, Cooking 101, etc.
- The green pages in the fair book correspond to the 4-H show in Fair Entry.
- The fair book will list the specific details for the project requirements. A 4-H member may only exhibit in **one** of the classes for a specified project area, Example: Cooking you can only enroll in Cooking 101, 201, 301 or 401, not 101 and 201. **DO NOT ENTER MULTIPLE CLASSES IN A PROJECT AREA**. If you do, you will receive a call or email asking you to fix your entries.
- Only 4-H members enrolled in the Shooting Sports Club may exhibit in the Shooting Sports classes.
- This is very important you may only exhibit 4-H projects that match to the projects in ZSuites!

#### Junior Fair Entries

- Youth may exhibit in any of the junior fair classes, excluding those that have specified dates such as steer weigh-in, horse ownership/lease forms that are submitted, etc. Example: if your youth likes to take photos, they could show those photos in the Junior Fair and not have photography as a 4-H project.
- Each youth exhibiting in the Junior Fair needs to complete an exhibitor card. One card per youth. If you have three youth in your family, you will need three entry cards.
- The Jr. Fair entry sheets are on yellow paper. The Jr. Fair entry forms correspond to the yellow pages in the fair book (pages 19-49).
- Each project area needs to have an entry form. Example: Woodworking and welding would go on separate forms
- Cloverbuds are not eligible to exhibit in the Junior Fair.

## **Tips on Fair Entries**

#### **Livestock Exhibitors!**

- **Showmanship classes** must be signed up in Fair Entry.
- When selecting classes in Fair Entry for any animal classes, *ALWAYS* start with Class 1. If you have 2 animals in the same breed, select class 1, then class 2. Example exhibiting 2 Angus heifers, select Angus Heifer 1 and Angus Heifer 2. This doesn't affect the breakout of classes at the fair but aids in entering fair entry results.
- Steer Classes Don't forget to sign-up for the corresponding Rate of Gain classes for either Steers, Bank Steers or Market Heifers.
- **Swine Exhibitors** If you exhibit a barrow, don't forget to sign up for the Carcass Class.
- **Swine Exhibitors** If you have two barrows, and meet the requirements in the fair book, sign up for a pair of barrows.
