

Welcome to the Real World 4-H Program at Charleston Middle School & Mattoon High School

This report is an essential component as it allows participants to reflect on their project journey, articulate what they have learned, and demonstrate their skills and knowledge in a structured way. By completing this report, youth gain a deeper understanding of their project's purpose and impact while practicing valuable life skills such as self-assessment and communication. The inclusion of the report ensures a consistent evaluation process and provides judges with insight into the effort, creativity, and growth behind each exhibit, highlighting the educational value of 4-H programs.



YQCA training

It's that time of year again! If you are receiving this email, your youth needs to complete the YQCA training for 2025. The YQCA training is required **YEARLY** for all members ages 8-18 exhibiting **beef**, **dairy**, **goats**, **sheep**, **and swine** at any 4-H livestock show. Youth have two options for completing this training: In-Person or online. See the list below to know who still needs to take this training.

The YQCA Training must be completed by June 1, 2025, to be eligible to show at the 2025 4-H Fair.

Note: If your youth is not exhibiting in a livestock show during 4-H Fair week, July 27 to July 31, 2025, then they do not need to complete this training, and you may ignore the email.

In-Person Instructor-Led Training:

Registration is required; see the blue button below. There is a \$3 fee and an online pre-test. The online pre-test **must** be completed before the in-person training date. Training must have a minimum of 5 members for it to occur. Choose the 2025 Coles 4-H In-Person YQCA Training title when registering.

The online training option for youth has a \$12 fee. There is no need to submit a certificate of

QAEC Training

The *Quality Assurance & Ethics Certification (QAEC)* training is **required** for all 4-H members ages 8–18 who plan to exhibit **cats**, **dogs**, **horses**, **poultry**, **or rabbits**.

The QAEC training is now available directly through the **Clover Academy** in the **ZSuite Enrollment System** at https://4h.zsuite.org. Once completed in ZSuite, there's no need to send in a certificate, but we do recommend keeping a copy for your personal 4-H records.

Poultry Update:

The Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) placed a 30-day suspension on the exhibition of poultry beginning February 11, 2025, due to the ongoing threat of H5N1 avian flu. IDOA has recently re-evaluated the situation and announced that the suspension will be extended for an additional 30 days, continuing through **May 11, 2025.**

Families with youth who may show in Poultry, please check your email for future updates.

What does this mean for our 4-H Poultry Show?

At this time, the suspension prohibits live poultry shows at county fairs. IDOA will re-evaluate the status of the suspension in early April, and they will decide whether to lift or continue it based on updated information.

In the event that the suspension remains in place during the 4-H show season, please know that we are committed to providing an alternative experience for our poultry exhibitors. We will share more details and options as the situation develops. <u>Poultry Exhibitors, please check your email for updates.</u>

BARROWS: Regular Barrows

- No weighing and tattooing is required, but you must submit ear notches and an EID 840 tag number when making an entry for ISF.

BARROWS: Premiere Barrows (carcass class)

- Farrowed on or after February 10, 2025, and must have been the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2025
- Weighed and Tattooed with Box A tattoo from February 10 to April 15, 2025
- Tattooed within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1.0 lbs/day of age
- Junior exhibitors can purchase pre-nominated barrows

SHEEP Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs: Live Show Wethers.

- Lambed on or after January 1, 2025
- Ownership Date May 15, 2025
- Self-nomination is as follows: Nominations must be signed by the local Extension Office.
- This must be completed by April 21, 2025, and send to Jessica Hays at <u>JNHays@illinois.edu</u> or by mail to

Jr. and Open Premiere Wether & Ewe lambs: - Weigh-in, tattoo, and nomination procedures:

- Junior and open premiere lambs will be nominated, tattooed, and weighed at the county level.
- Premiere lambs must be weighed and tattooed with the Box A tattoo followed by a number starting with 1 - This must be witnessed by a local Extension employee or a person they designate, such as a volunteer or local sheep superintendent.
- Completed nomination forms must be signed by the local Extension Office.

2025 Breeding Animals Birth & Ownership Dates for Illinois State Fair Junior Show

BEEF - HEIFERS AND COWS:

Heifers

- Age requirement is from September 1, 2023 to March 31, 2025 (w/ addition of Senior Yearling class)
- Owned and personally cared for by exhibitor since June 1, 2025

Performance Cows

- Cows must be born before September 1, 2023 (Cow-Calf Class only)
- Owned and personally cared by exhibitor since January 1, 2025

SWINE - GILTS:

- Age requirement is farrowed on or after January 1, 2025
- Owned by exhibitor since June 1, 2025

<u>SHEEP – EWES & RAMS:</u>

- Age requirement for yearling ewes is from January 1, 2024 to August 31, 2024
- Age requirement for ewe lambs is after September 1, 2024
- Age requirement for ram lambs is after January 1, 2025
- Owned and personally cared for by exhibitor since June 25, 2025

DAIRY – COWS AND HEIFERS:

- No age requirements
- Calves and Heifers Owned since June 1, 2025
- Cows Owned since January 1, 2025

HORSE & PONY:

On or before June 1 – Copies of the ownership and/or lease papers, and one set of photos sent to Jessica Hays at <u>JNHays@illinois.edu</u> or by mail to:

DOGS:

- Dogs must be owned or leased by June 1, 2025
- At this time, no paperwork is required to be on file. Make entries via 4-H Fair Entry Program.

DAIRY GOATS:

- Kids and Yearlings not in milk must be owned by the exhibitor only by June 1, 2025.
- Milking Does must be owned by the exhibitor only by January 1, 2025.

MEAT GOATS:

 All meat goats (wethers and all breeding animals) are to be owned by exhibitor by May 15, 2025.

RABBITS, PYGMY GOATS & POULTRY:

 Animals in these species that are to be exhibited at the ISF Jr. Show must be owned by the exhibitor as indicated: Does -- By June 1 of the year exhibiting; All others -- Out of stock owned by the exhibitor prior to June 1.


