5. Garden Tours

Who helps in the gardens? What are we growing? What happens with the food? Is it a traditional community garden or educational garden?

Great tours of the gardens.

<u>Buchanan Street Community Garden</u> – is on city property. The city allows us to use the water for the gardens. This year they did some garden bed repair for us. Soil contact for next year is Belvidere Cemetery. 4-H Juntos Club works in the garden with Master Gardeners twice a month. Produce is shared with the community at the share table located down the street.

<u>Rick John's Memorial Garden</u> – Lots of technology in their garden with keeping track of soil temperature and moisture. NIU students work with a Master Gardener in the garden. A grant allowed them to make some changes last year to the space. They grow a lot of produce and share it with the local pantry. The students also help with the distribution of the food.

Flagg-Rochelle Library – The Master Gardeners work with a 4-H Club in the gardens. They were there during the tour doing some planting. There are 5 garden beds that the youth work in. They will be growing produce to show at the Olge County Fair. There is an extra garden bed there that will be an educational garden for the Homegrown Healthy program that will be offered at the library this summer with the help of the Master Gardeners. They have it set up for doing square foot gardening.

6. Summer Focus - Farmer's Markets

Boone – Looking into potentially going once a month 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Belvidere, Wild Cherries Master Gardeners will be at the Farmers Market ten times this summer to connect with the community.

DeKalb – Looking into DeKalb area market

Connie will work with the Master Gardeners to see if they can make a connection with being at the DeKalb Market.

Ogle – Scheduled to go the third Thursday night in June and July in Oregon Candie suggested looking into the Byron Farmers Market as another possible location as that one seems to be growing over the years.

Information at the booth would be geared around gardening. Mental health benefits of gardening, healthy choices, recipes of what's available at the market, etc. Master Gardeners to help answer gardening questions.

Suggestions for the Farmers Markets was to have maps and lists of where the local community gardens are located in the county. Also would be good to have a list of where the local food pantries are or organizations that are hosting food distribution days such as the Keen Age Center. Lists can be found on health department websites as well as with local hunger coalitions.
