Required Forms on Web

There are a few events which require forms to be filled out and brought with you to the event at the 4-H Show. If you are participating in the fashion revue, you should have received a form in with your show tags to fill out and return to Amy by Monday afternoon July 7th.

If you will be absent from the shows please email Lindsay or Amy for a form to fill out to be placed with your projects.



If you are showing a photography project and you have pictures with another person in them, you must fill out the photo release, and have that person, or their legal guardian, sign, and then bring it with you to the show.

Before the Show - Read this carefully - New info

1. **PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT** - Getting good takes practice. So, if you are enrolled in a food project, you need to practice making many of the recipes in your food manual. If you are enrolled in woodworking, you need to make several woodworking items to get used to working with the tools. If you are enrolled in sewing, you need to make more than one item to get the hang of using a sewing machine. Then check the Show/ Guidebook to see **EXACTLY** which item you should bring to the 4-H Show.

2. **CLUB MEETINGS** - You can learn a lot about the Show from your club members. Be sure to attend this month. You must have attended at least 4 club meetings by July 1 to be allowed to exhibit at the Show. Your leader will tell me if you do not qualify.

3. **TAGS** - You should have received the exhibit tags for each of the 4-H projects you entered for this year's 4-H Show in the mail. There are no tags for livestock projects, rabbits or poultry. **PLEASE DO NOT LOSE THESE TAGS**. Attach the tag to some part of your exhibit when you bring it to the show. If you are missing a tag, call the office.

4. **RULES FOR EXHIBITS** - Check the 2025 White County 4-H & Policy Manual: Guidebook & Show book. You can download a copy of the book at: http://extension.illinois.edu/ghhpsw/. The first few pages have general rules about the Show. The rest of the book has <u>specific exhibit rules</u> for each project. **READ THE RULES CAREFULLY AND FOLLOW THEM EXACTLY**. These rules change every year, so it's very important to use the guidebook from this year when preparing your exhibit.

5.**GENERAL SHOW PROJECTS** - General show projects can be dropped off Monday evening July 7, from 4-8:00 at the floral hall.

6. JUDGING TIMES ASSIGNED THIS YEAR! Amy will email, text, or call you with your judging times the week before the shows. PLEASE PLAN ON BEING A LITTLE EARLY FOR YOUR JUDGING TIMES, WE DON'T WANT TO BE WAITING ON YOU!

7. **RULES FOR LIVESTOCK** - All livestock exhibitors, including rabbits and horses, were mailed specific health requirement rules for exhibiting their animals; follow them carefully. Check the schedule to know when your animals must be at the fairgrounds.

8. **ADULT HELP NEEDED** - Many adults are needed to make the Show run smoothly. Club leaders are asked to provide as many helpers as possible for the Show. If your parent can help, please call the office at 382-2662 as soon as possible.

Dog & Cat Exhibitors

Dog and Cat Exhibitors are reminded to bring their animals' current and up-to-date shot record to the 4-H shows on July 5.

NO ANIMALS WILL BE ALLOWED AT THESE SHOWS WITHOUT SHOT RECORDS. Also, no choke collars or harness for the dogs. All animals are to be on a leash.

The Day of the Show

- Check the schedule/email to see which day your project is to be exhibited and judging times..
- Check to see what time your project must be in place. (General Projects drop off is Monday 4:00-8:00)
- Check to see how long your exhibit must stay at the fairgrounds.
- 4-H'ers must be present and speak with the judge while their project is being judged. (Absentee forms are available)
- Check the schedule to see how long each Show lasts. Some days you may be at the fairgrounds for several hours. Take along fun things to keep you busy.

You will talk with a judge about each exhibit you bring. RELAX! A judge will not try to trick or scare you. The judge will probably ask how you made the exhibit, what steps you used, and what materials you used. They may ask what you learned. They may ask what areas you had trouble with. They may ask what other things you made in the project. They may ask if you had fun! The most important thing is to **be honest** with the judge. If you don't know an answer, simply say, "I don't know." If you got help from your family, tell the judge that too (for safety reasons, some parts of projects *should* be done with adults).

GRADES AND RIBBONS

4-H rewards you for all you've learned by giving you a grade, ribbon, and money based on how well you complete your project for the Show. Your "grade" at the 4-H Show is determined by the score you receive from the judge. The judge uses a score sheet designed just for your project.

If your project "**MEETS ALL THE STANDARDS**" on the score sheet, it will receive a BLUE RIBBON.

If your project "**NEEDS SOME IMPROVEMENT**," it will receive a RED RIBBON.

If your project "**NEEDS MUCH IMPROVEMENT**," it will receive a WHITE RIBBON.

If your exhibit doesn't follow all the rules in the Guidebook, IT CANNOT RECEIVE A BLUE RIBBON. That's why it is so important to read the GUIDEBOOK.

In addition to your blue, red or white ribbon, the judge can award extra ribbons and prizes.

BEST OF SHOW—One top exhibit in each class can be picked as the "best" that day and will receive a "Best of Show" ribbon. Only blue-ribbon projects can be picked as "Best of Show" winners.

SUPERIOR—If a judge thinks that an exhibit is outstanding and is far better than some of the other exhibits, he/she may give it a "Superior" ribbon. It's all up to the judge. He/She may give one, several, or no superiors. Just because an exhibit gets a Best of Show ribbon doesn't mean it will win a Superior. Some judges give lots; some give none.

STATE FAIR—4-H members who were at least 8 years old before September 1, 2023 may be selected to take their exhibit to the State Fair. Many times, 4-H'ers get selected to go to the State Fair in many projects, but you may only pick one. The State Fair is held Friday, August 8 in Springfield.



IF YOU ARE SELECTED FOR Illinois State Fair

...it should be displayed with a green ribbon on your project and also an Illinois 4-H Show postcard taped to your project. You must have been 8 before Sept. 1, 2024 to qualify. If you wish to participate in the Illinois State Fair, you must let the Extension Office know by **Monday, July 21.** Alternates will be notified of any openings on or

before July 25. No entries will be allowed after July 28.

- ALL White County exhibits will be judged at the State Fair on **Friday**, **August 8**.
- Members may exhibit in only 1 project. If you were selected in more than 1 project, you must choose which project you wish to exhibit at the State Fair.

- Participants must take their own projects to the State Fair. All projects must be signed in between 8:00-9:00am and will be released after 3:30pm. No security will be provided.
- The White County Extension Office will not order any parking passes or entry tickets. You may purchase tickets at the fair gate. You will not be able to park in the normal lot, but suitable parking is available.
- It is important for participants to understand all the rules, times, and requirements before they leave for the Fair.

A Note to Parents...put it in perspective

First, try to put the 4-H Show in perspective. The county 4-H show is one part of the 4-H learning experience. Serving as an officer or on a committee, giving a talk or demonstration, attending workshops, completing a project, and going to camp are some of the hundreds of experiences a 4-H'er gains throughout the year.

The development of young people is our first consideration in 4-H work. We are more concerned about what the 4-H'er learns than with the exhibit. If you have concerns during the 4-H Show, DO NOT approach judges or superintendents directly.

FIRST, go to your club leader. If your leader is not present, express your concern to a staff member. Remember, we may not always agree with a judge's decision, but they are the expert for the day, and as so, deserve our respect. Most have donated their time for YOUR child. It is never appropriate to be verbally abusive to a judge or superintendent.

Part of learning to win is learning to lose. Praise your child accordingly, and teach by example.

Archery/Rifle/Shot Gun Shoots

The archery, rifle, pistol, and shot gun shoots are available to all White County Shooting Stars SPIN Club members who have been active in the club this past 2024-2025 4-H year. And have come to at least 3 shoots. The shoot will take

place at the Carmi Rifle Club at 2:00pm on Sunday, July 6. Come and watch your fellow 4-H'ers compete.



Tractor Driving Contest

The Tractor Driving contest will be Tuesday, July 8 from 9:00 - ? for members during the general show. This year we are not planning on having a later time scheduled, so come early if you can! Show up to cheer on your tractor driving friends. Boys and girls ages 8 and up are welcome!



Community invited to Youth Pedal Pull

Area youth are invited to the 2025 Youth Pedal Pull event on Wednesday, July 9. The event will begin at 3:30 p.m. and will take place at the White County Fairgrounds beside the Floral Hall pavilion.

All area youth are invited to participate in the pedal pull. Three classes for both girls and boys will be offered. Weight classes will be: CLASS 1 - 50 lbs. and under; CLASS 2 - 51 lbs. to 75 lbs.; CLASS 3 - 76 lbs. and over. There is a maximum age limit of 12

years old. First and second place trophies will be awarded in each class. Registration will begin at 3:00 p.m. the day of the event. The event will run from 3:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m.

MORE IMPORTANT INFORMATION

• NO ONE, EXCEPT SUPERINTENDENTS, WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE BUILDING BEFORE 8 AM ON MONDAY, JULY 7 AND TUESDAY, JULY 8.

- 4-H'ers should first report to their club table at the front of the exhibit building. They should notify the check-in person of any exhibit they DID NOT bring. Also, check judging times set for you. Then, 4-H'ers should go set up their exhibit at the appropriate project table, (General Show Projects if unable to deliver on Monday evening.) REMEMBER: There is no size restrictions on projects, except county projects.
- Your project must stay at the Floral Hall until Wednesday at 6pm! YOU MUST MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO HAVE SOMEONE PICK UP YOUR PROJECT IF YOU ARE NOT ABLE TO PICK IT UP AFTER THE AWARDS PROGRAM!
- NOTE: No parents are allowed in the judging area until all judging is completed! Please respect this rule. I encourage you to bring things to keep busy. 4-H'ers will be called to speak to the judge by the superintendent for each area. Donuts, milk and orange juice will be available for breakfast donated by Casey's General Store. Activities will be available to do outside both days to keep the congestion down inside the floral hall.
- It's important to remember that no matter what ribbon your project receives,
 YOU ARE A BLUE-RIBBON KID! As long as you did your best, that's all that matters.
 Be polite to all the adults working and helping with the 4-H Show.
