

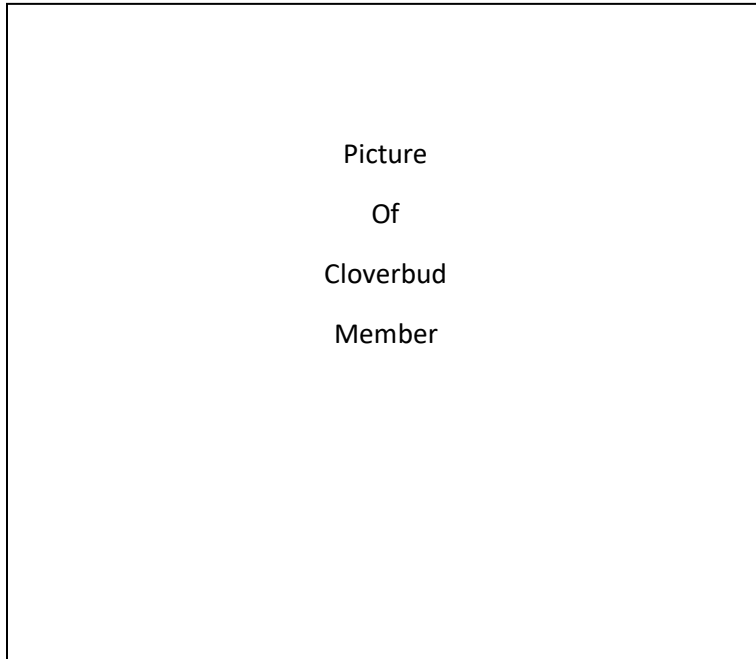


Cloverbud Record Book
