

### **DeWitt, Macon, and Piatt County Youth Awards**



\*All 4-H Club Officer Positions will be recognized.

**President** | Must complete the application and 4-H story.

**Vice president** | Must complete the application and 4-H story.

**Secretary** | Must complete the application and 4-H story. Submit the secretary book and all the supplemental material. The secretary's book may be typed or handwritten, but all additional sections of the secretary's book must be completed.

**Treasurer** | Must complete the application and 4-H story. Submit the treasurer book, bank statements, and all supplemental material. The audit must be completed and signed.

**Reporter** | Must complete the application and 4-H story. Submit all club reports in a binder or folder. Include copies or photocopies of the newspaper stories or press releases that appeared in the newspaper, pictures of members at any 4-H activity or event, copies of any 4-H program or flyer for a club event, and a summary sheet that tells how many stories, articles or press releases you have written during the 4-H year.

**Scrapbook/Historian** | Must complete the application and 4-H story. Submit the club scrapbook which should include preservation of the 4-H club's memories, interesting and variety of page layouts, chronological or thematic order of pages, neatness, correct spelling, and appropriate journaling on the pages.

**Recreational Leader** | Must complete the application and 4-H story.

Greeter | Must complete the application and 4-H story.

## **Additional County Youth Awards**

**Cloverbud Recognition** | Draw a picture or write about your favorite part of 4-H Cloverbuds this year. All Cloverbuds who submit an application (pages 1-2) and drawing or writing will be recognized. No 4-H Story required.

**Outstanding First Year 4-H Member** | Must complete the application and 4-H story. When applying for this award, judges will be looking for growth, new experiences, and overall participation in your first year. One member per county will be recognized.

**Accomplished Member** | For members 16-19 years old on September 1 of application year. Must complete the application and 4-H story. When applying for this award, judges will be looking for leadership, personal growth, demonstration of responsibility, awareness of issues beyond self, and overall pride for 4-H. One member per county will be recognized.



### **DeWitt, Macon, and Piatt County Youth IMPACT Awards**



Youth IMPACT awards will be awarded based on points. One awardee per county, per award, per age group.

**Community Service** | Focus of your 4-H work in service to/for others. Work should focus on what you have done as an individual. Must complete the 4-H story AND this impact statement.

**Project Mastery** | Focus of your 4-H work in your primary project (ex. woodworking, photography, beef). Only one project should be included in the application and members should not submit an application in more than one 'Project Mastery' area. Must complete the 4-H story AND this impact statement.

**Communication** | Focus of your 4-H work in the art of communicating with others, including but not limited to public presentations, 4-H Ambassadors, Speaking for Illinois 4-H, television/radio interviews, etc. Must complete the 4-H story AND this impact statement.

**Personal Growth** | Focus on your own personal growth through participating in the 4-H program. This could include but not limited to growth in skills, demonstrated initiative, self-confidence, interpersonal interactions, poise, etc. Must complete the 4-H story AND this impact statement.

**Leadership** | Focus on the development of your leadership skills, including offices held, committees served on, programs led, and public presentations on behalf of 4-H. Must complete the 4-H story AND this impact statement.



### **DeWitt, Macon, Piatt County Adult Awards**



\*One awardee per county.

**4-H Leader of the Year Award** Anyone may nominate one or more leaders for the 4-H Leader of the Year Award. This award will go to a leader who has gone above and beyond to help our 4-H members to make the best better.

**4-H Alumni Award** This special award is given annually to honor one or two past 4-H club members who have an outstanding record of accomplishments related to good citizenship. They do not have to have been members in your county growing up. It provides recognition to 4-H alumni whose contributions to society exemplify effective citizenship and leadership, success in their chosen careers, and a sustaining interest in 4-H and similar worthy community endeavors such as church, school, public, civic or youth activities. Members, leaders and volunteers may make nominations. Medals are provided by the Illinois 4-H Foundation.

**Friend of 4-H Award** | This special award is designed to honor businesses and individuals who have contributed significantly to the local 4-H and Extension program over several years. Members, leaders, and volunteers may make nominations. A plaque will be awarded.

**4-H Family Spirit Award** | This award is designed to honor a 4-H family that encompasses the 4-H motto in everything they do. They advocate for the 4-H program and strive to better their family and community through 4-H. A plaque will be awarded.

**Clover Club Challenge** | Complete one or more "BINGO" on the form to receive a club award. A BINGO may go up/down, across, or diagonal. Fill in the details to show how the club completed the action on the backside of the application.

**Citizenship Club Report** | Answer questions to explain how your club was involved in citizenship activities this year. The top clubs will be recognized.

I Dare You Award | This county award is leader-nominated. This leadership award was first offered in 1941 by businessman and philanthropist, William H. Danforth, who dared young people to achieve their highest potential and to influence others through lives of service. Youth must be at least 14 years old to be nominated. 4-H members are selected for this award only once. 4-H members, who demonstrate personal integrity, lead well-rounded lives, and possess a willingness to assume responsibility should be considered for this award. Those nominated for this award should be "emerging" leaders – those youth who have the qualities and the abilities to lead, but who may not yet recognize or act on their leadership potential.



## Illinois 4-H (State Level) Youth & Club Awards and Scholarships

#### Awards:

*Illinois 4-H Experience Award for Individuals* | The Experience Award offers recognition for members who participate in activities and events. There are always lots of activities you can do as a 4-H member ranging from club to national events.

*Illinois 4-H Electricity Award* | This award recognizes 4-H members who excel in the electricity project.

**Illinois 4-H Sustaining the Future Award** | The Illinois 4-H Sustaining the Future Award was created to recognize 4-H members who have exemplified outstanding leadership within the agricultural industry. (Formerly known as the LCP Award)

**4-H Club Recognition (EXCEL – Club Award)** | 4-H Clubs that EXCEL in their work can compete for state honors in one or more specific award areas. Award areas include: Community Service, Leadership, or Project Mastery.

**Holstein-Friesian Association Award** | Members must be enrolled in the Dairy project and exhibit Holstein dairy animals at the county 4-H show.

## **Scholarships:**

Illinois 4-H State Award Scholarships | This award recognizes youth who have demonstrated and maintained a high standard of 4-H excellence and mastery during their membership tenure. All of the scholarship programs are available on a competitive basis.

Superior Young Producer Scholarship | The program is sponsored by the Illinois State Fair. Three \$1,000 scholarships are awarded each year in dairy; and nine scholarships are distributed among beef, sheep and swine project members. Contests are held during the Illinois State Fair. Members must compete in 3 to 4 individual segments that include: management test, skill-a-thon, judging contest, and/or meat identification or testing. Contestants must be 14 - 18 years of age to compete.
