4-H Enrollment System -ZSuites

Illinois 4-H has set October 1 as the target date to open ZSuites for enrollment for the 2025-2026 4-H year. Please do not enroll until you have received an email stating ZSuites is open!

Families will be responsible for paying \$10 of the \$20 program fee for 2025-2026 with Shelby Extension Foundation paying the other \$10. Families will be able to pay program fees online via a credit card or with cash or check to their club leader. Please note - there are a few clubs that are paying their member's program fees so please check with your club leader regarding payment status.

If your family is enrolling more than 3 children, you may submit your enrollment but do not pay online. The 4th child discount will need to be applied before payment can be made. Once the discount has been applied, Yolanda will notify you for payment. Refunds can not be issued if you pay for more than three children.

Members must be enrolled and approved in ZSuites before participating in any county event including Shooting Sports, parades, workshops, etc.

Enrolling in projects in ZSuites

Multiple project areas are NOT Allowed!

Per IL State 4-H Office Guidelines, 4-H members may only enroll in one level of a project area. If multiple project area's are selected during the enrollment process, either your enrollment may be returned to the family to fix or an email will be sent to the family from Yolanda, asking which level of project you wish to be enrolled in. Duplicate project area's will not be allowed. Enrollments WILL NOT be approved if multiple project area's are selected. Examples: Woodworking 1 and Woodworking 2, Cooking 101 and Cooking 201, Floriculture A and Floriculture D. Families may change the project areas until May 1.

Air Rifle Season with Shelby Shooters

October 30

Shelby County 4-H is excited to announce the start of its Air Rifle season, hosted by the Shelby Shooters SPIN Club. The program kicks off on Thursday, October 30 and will be held at the Shelby County 4-H Center. Participants must be on the line and ready to shoot by 6:00 p.m. Sessions will run on the following dates on Thursday evenings: October 30 – November 20, December 11 & 18

To participate, youth must be enrolled in ZSuites and have paid their \$10 4-H program fee by October 20. In addition, there is a \$10 administrative fee and a \$30 air rifle fee for the season. Youth who are not properly enrolled or have unpaid fees will not be permitted to shoot.

BB sessions will run the same schedule as Air Rifle but isn't affiliated with the 4-H program.

For families facing financial hardship, fee waivers are available through the Shelby County Junior Rifle Club Association. Questions about the program or fee assistance can be directed to Kelly Barringer, Shelby Shooters SPIN Club leader, at 217-369-6860.

Shelby County 4-H Archery Program

October 20

Shelby County 4-H is gearing up for another exciting season of archery, with sessions beginning October 20 and running through December 15 (excluding November 17). Practices will be held on Monday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. at the Shelby County 4-H Center.

At the first session, instructors will assign shooting times for future practices. To take part, youth must be current 4-H members enrolled in ZSuites and have paid their \$10 program fee by October 20. Additionally, there is a \$10 administrative fee and a \$20 archery fee for the season. Youth who are not enrolled or have unpaid fees will not be allowed to participate.

A limited number of bows are available for use, and members may bring their own equipment. All personal bows will be subject to a safety check by instructors before use.

For families experiencing financial hardship, fee waivers are available through the Shelby County Junior Rifle Club Association. For questions or more information, contact Kelly Barringer, Shelby Shooters SPIN Club leader, at 217-369-6860.

Deadline Friday, November 14

Are you interested in raising, showing and selling a steer as a 4-H project? The Shelby County State Bank is offering interest-free loans to Shelby County 4-H members to assist them in purchasing a steer to exhibit at the fair.

In order to be eligible to participate in this program, the 4-H member must have been enrolled in 4-H at least one previous year. Members must complete enrollment in ZSuites and pay the \$10 program fee by November 14.

Note - new families will have an on-farm visit from the Bank Steer Committee prior to steer weigh-in, all participants will have an onfarm visit in the Spring by the Bank Steer Committee. Shelby County State Bank reserves the right to deny any individual participation in the Bank Steer Program.

The deadline to sign up for a bank steer is November 14. Pick-up for steers will be on February 14 at the county steer weigh-in.
