- It is income-based, through receiving funds from HUD (Housing and Urban Development)
- The building is owned by McLean County Extension Foundation which was bought in 2022
- Part of the Food distribution for the Mid-West Food Bank
- A proposal was submitted to redo the library space, to the 100 Women for Good, which is a group of 100 Woment donating \$100.00 each for a good cause, funding from the 100 Women for Good and from the Local Foundation. The plan for the area is to make the space more community friendly for a variety of program activities.

# **Fiscal Reports and Funding Update**

- FY25 Budget no print outs, there are no changes to the budget, we are still one month behind on receiving the financials, March reconciliation was recently signed off; Aprils was just received and working on them.
- McLean County is still in a six figure deficit, close to \$200,000; expect to come out of the deficit; Met with the McLean County Board and a request was put in to increase the levy funding by \$100,000. Instead of getting \$300,000 as we did for FY26, it will be increased to \$400,000.
- Receives weekly updates and from Campus with regards to what's getting funding and grants that's available
- SNAP-Ed funds questions and answers were discussed
- discussions were held followed by questions and answers with regards to the budgets and funding and staffing.
