4-H Enrollment is Now Open in ZSuites!

All 4-H members must be enrolled, have paid their program fee, and be approved in ZSuites before participating in any club, county, or state activities.

Program Fee for 2025–2026:

- Total fee: \$20 per member
- Families pay \$10, and Shelby Extension Foundation covers \$10.
- Payment options:
 - Online via credit card
 - Cash or check to your club leader

Important Notes:

- Some clubs are covering their members' program fees—please check with your club leader.
- If enrolling more than 3 children, submit enrollment but do not pay online. The 4th child discount will be applied first. Yolanda will notify you when payment is ready.
- Refunds cannot be issued if you pay for more than three children before the discount is applied.
