NEW YEAR REMINDERS

- Complete online enrollments for 2025 -2026. October 1, 2025 - May 1, 2026. 4h.zsuite.org
- Attend at least 1 club meeting (4-Hers are ineligible to show at the fair if they do not attend at least one meeting. Parents are encouraged to attend meetings and volunteer when the leader needs help.)
- Choose at least one project
- Order my project books at go.illinois.edu/ **FMPTPubs**
- If doing a live animal project, complete ethics training
 - YQCA required <u>annually</u> if exhibiting Beef, Dairy, Goats, Sheep, or Swine
 - QAEC required once if exhibiting Cats, Dogs, Horses, Poultry, or Rabbits
 - Must be completed by July 15
- Read the exhibit requirements for my projects in the show book, which is made available to families in the spring
- Complete the FairEntry registration by the deadline to officially register for exhibit classes at the 4-H Show.
- Prepare for show dates (July 2026). Exhibitors must be present for in-person judging. Tazewell County 4-H Show dates are July 27, 28, 29, 2026

ENROLLMENT FAQ'S

THE NOVEMBER 30 DEADLINE HAS PASSED. AM I STILL ABLE TO ENROLL IN 4-H?

YES! Though the window to enroll in 4-H for free has closed, you can still enroll through May 1. However, a \$5 enrollment fee will apply for up to three household members. If there are more than three 4-H members in your household, you only need to pay for three of them (maximum \$15).

WHO NEEDS TO ENROLL IN 4-H?

Only youth 4-H members and volunteers who have been through the official screening process. Parents do not need to enroll.

WHAT IF I'M STILL DECIDING ON MY PROJECTS FOR THIS YEAR?

If you have already enrolled, you can still make changes to your projects through May 1.

2026 FAIR FUN PLANNING COMMITTEE

Do you want to have a say in what fun things are planned for the 2026 4-H Show and Junior Fair? We would love to have your input and urge you to consider joining our Fair Fun Planning Committee! This committee is responsible for planning fun things for fairgoers, coordinating volunteers to run fair events, and securing funds to make those things possible. Any commitment, big or small, would be welcome! This committee is open to parents, past 4-Hers, and current 4-Hers ages 14 and older. This committee does not require screened volunteer status! Committee meetings are typically in the afternoon or evening starting in the spring. Please reach out to Abbie and Lynda if you are interested in being on the Fair Fun Planning Committee!



CALL FOR CLOVERBUD LEADERS

We are always looking for 4-H parents and alumni (ages 19+) who are interested in being a screened volunteer. This year, we are specifically looking for those who would be interested in being a Cloverbud club leader! Cloverbuds are ages 5 to 7 (as of Sept 1). Typically, Cloverbud clubs meet at the same time and place as a regular 4-H club but split off to do more age appropriate activities. If this sounds like something you or someone you know would be interested in, please let Abbie or Lynda know!



REPORTING CONTINUING ED HOURS

Once again this year Illinois 4-H is requesting that each screened volunteer completes three hours of continuing education. Volunteers now have the ability report continuing education hours that are not taught by 4-H staff! The topic of your learning does need to relate to youth development or be applicable to your role as a 4-H volunteer.

How to report non-4H led hours ZSuite:

- 1. Go to zsuite.4h.org and log in
- 2. Choose your profile
- 3. Click on Events on the left side of your screen
- 4. Find the events called "Self Reported Continuing Education" There should be three of these events each with 1, 2, and 3 hour reporting options
- 5. Fill out the registration form just as you if you were registering for an event
- 6. Make sure to attach some sort of proof of attendance at the end of the form (agenda, course outline, ect)

Any event that counts for continuing education that is taught by 4-H staff will be automatically recorded for you, so please do not fill out the form for those events.
