2025-2026 GOAT CHANGES

Please note the following updates for the coming year regarding market goats for the Monroe County Fair:

The birth date for market goats has been moved from "after October 1" to "after April 1, 2025." Exhibitors who wish to participate in the Monroe Co. Fair and State Fair can still exhibit a child born after October 1.

In addition, the recommendations of an average daily gain of 0.20 and an ideal weight of 75 pounds by the second weigh-in at the fair will remain. Please note that these are still recommendations as we move toward adjusting the birth date.

The goal is to increase the quality of meat sold to consumers. The U of I Meat Sciences Instructor has emphasized the importance of backfat in producing high-quality meat. Goats without sufficient backfat tend to dry out excessively when hanging at the packers, which reduces meat quality. Allowing for slightly older animals will increase the likelihood of adequate backfat development, ultimately leading to a better product for buyers.

LIVESTOCK & HORSE RECORD BOOKS

All members are highly encouraged to fill out a 4-H Record Book for livestock and/or horse projects they are exhibiting at a 4-H Show.

It is REQUIRED to fill out 4-H Record Books for any livestock that members are selling at the Youth Livestock Auction.

Members must complete a livestock record book in the current year to be eligible to sell in the preceding year, except for new members or members not previously enrolled in that project.

In-progress Record Books should be shown by your leader at your May, June, or July club meeting before 4-H Shows.
