5. Current projects/programs

- Annual Garden Day for Ogle, Carroll, Lee, and Whiteside Counties- Ready Set Grow: Saturday, March 28 at Sauk Valley Community College. Piloting programming for the whole family at Ready Set Grow this year: Adult track with concurrent session for youth to provide easier access to the event for parents and caregivers.
- Ogle County Master Gardeners had their annual Seed Library Kick-Off on January 31, which is National Seed Swap Day, at Flagg-Rochelle Library. We had 50 participants come through during the two-hour event with included interactive activities, make and takes, tastings and free seeds.
- Boone County Master Gardeners received a Know More, Grow More Grant, for 2026, that will be used to continue the Buchanan Street Gardens. The vegetable garden is a collaboration between the Master Gardeners and 4-H in which the food is given to the local share table food pantry.
- DeKalb County Master Gardeners hosted a Seed Exchange/Giveaway at the DeKalb Public Library on January 31. 95 participants attended the 3-hour, come and go event. The annual Gardener's Pathway gardening conference is set for February 28 at the DeKalb County Farm Bureau. Registration closed on February 14 with approximately 130 participants.
