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Junior Fair Show - Rules and Regulations

The general supervision of the grounds and entire exhibition is vested in a board of directors, who will have immediate charge of the grounds and assign such aid to superintendents as may be required, receive exhibitors on their arrival and direct them to the proper places, and see that none of the rules are violated with impunity.

General Eligibility Rules

Notice: Throughout this show book, the phrase "past year" will mean 2025, and the phrase "present year" will mean 2026.

THESE RULES APPLY TO ALL CLASSES IN THIS CATALOG

1. Entries are limited to LaSalle County residents or youth enrolled in a LaSalle County 4-H Club.
2. Eligibility to show is limited to boys and girls who are 8 years of age or in third grade and not yet 21 years of age on or before September 1 of the past year.
3. The interpretation of all rules governing the Junior Fair shall rest entirely with the Junior Fair Association Board and the decision shall be final.
4. All animals exhibited must be owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor, and feed records must be available for all animals if requested by the fair management. Each exhibitor must personally care for the animal during the feeding period, or required tenure of ownership. (Attending school or college away from home, or working away from home for an extended period may be considered cause for ineligibility). Failure to comply with this rule may result in disqualification, and forfeiture of premiums.
5. All animals must be exhibited in the show ring by the owner unless special permission is granted by the board of directors. (upon permission - by other youth between eight and 21 years of age).
6. All purebred animals shown must be owned by the exhibitor and must be registered in the name of the exhibitor, the only exception being horses and ponies which may be leased.
7. All animals on the fairgrounds must be entered in the fair.
8. All livestock exhibitors are subject to Illinois health regulations which are included in this fair book. Swine, Dairy, and Beef animals need to have an USDA official animal identification number ear tag ("840" tag). Paper copies or electronic copies of your health papers need to be in the fair office by 4 pm on Thursday. Electronic copies can be e-mailed to lasallemountjuniorfair@gmail.com.
9. All Junior Fair entries can be made at the fairgrounds on June 2, 3 pm to 5 pm; June 13, 8 am to 1 pm; June 16, 4 pm to 7 pm; June 20, 8 am to 1 pm; June 22, 4 pm to 7 pm. If you're unable to make these times, your entries may be dropped off outside of the LaSalle County Farm Bureau building in the LaSalle County Junior Fair drop box, or call 815 200-3913 to line up a time. All entries are due no later than 7 pm, June 22nd.
ENTRY FEES AND STALL FEES must accompany entry forms.
10. Animals must be on the grounds by 1:00 p.m. Thursday, July 9th.
11. No animals can be removed from the grounds until notice is given by the General Superintendent at 4:00 p.m. and must be removed from stalls by 6:00 p.m. Sunday, July 12th. This rule is STRICTLY ENFORCED. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of all premiums and other awards. Plus, the exhibitor will not be allowed to show in the LaSalle County Junior Fair for the following two years.
12. No person except exhibitors will be permitted in the ring while animals are being judged. The exhibitor is responsible for having livestock and other exhibits in the show ring at the time classes are called.

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NO alcoholic beverages, smoking, weapons, or dogs allowed on the 4-H Fairgrounds.

13. Use and possession of intoxicating beverages and drugs for livestock and human consumption is strictly prohibited on grounds.
14. Each exhibitor will be responsible for keeping their pens and stalls clean and bedded.
15. All feed boxes, pails, etc. must be kept neatly stored, and alleyways must be kept cleared and clean at all times.
16. Exhibitors display their exhibits at their own risk.
17. No exhibitors will be allowed to stay overnight at the LaSalle County 4-H Show and Junior Fair prior to, during, or after the fair.
18. The Junior Fair Board reserves the authority to combine or create new classes, if number warrants this to make a better show.
19. All animals presented for exhibition must be free of any artificial attachments or practices that would alter their natural conformation and/or color.
20. All exhibits must be in place at designated times unless previously excused by that species superintendent and general livestock superintendent.
21. NO EXHIBITOR WILL BE PERMITTED TO LEAVE LIVESTOCK TRAILERS AT THE FAIRGROUNDS. All livestock trailers need to be off the fairgrounds by 3 pm on Thursday. ONE LIVESTOCK TRAILER WILL BE AVAILABLE ON THE PREMISES FOR EMERGENCIES. No campers on fairgrounds except for fair board and vendors with pre-approval.
22. No use of animal tranquilizers or injectable drugs of any sort will be permitted on any animal exhibited by any exhibitor during the fair.
23. Showmanship categories are as follows: Junior (ages 8-10 years old as of Sept. 1, 2025); Intermediate (ages 11-13 years old as of Sept. 1, 2025); and Senior (ages 14-18 years old as of Sept. 1, 2025); Young Adult (19-20 years old as of Sept 1, 2025) unless otherwise noted. Showmanship classes are only open to the youth who showed an animal in that species.
24. While on the fairgrounds, livestock are to be cared for by the exhibitor or his or her immediate family except with prior approval of the superintendent and Fair Board President.
25. Judges may not judge projects of their own children, grandchildren or close relatives and friends.
26. Premium checks are valid for 90 days following the fair.

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RULES

- A. Read all Junior Show General Eligibility Rules.
- B. Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries in each class.
- C. Exhibitors must show their own animal unless they have two in the same class. The second animal must be shown by another Junior.
- D. Cow-Calf class: Cows will be shown with calf at side. Cows must be broke to lead. Breed winners will compete for Champion Female Breeding Cow/Calf Trophy.
- E. First and second place winners, except cow/calf, will show for the breed champion and reserve champion.
- F. Breed champions and reserve champions will show for Grand Champion Breeding heifer and Reserve Grand Champion breeding heifer.
- G. The Superintendent will check health and registration papers of ALL Purebred Beef Heifers/Steers at check in. 840 tags will be checked on all animals.
- H. Registration papers will be required in all purebred classes and must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor only (no partner-ownership). Effective dates for ownership must appear on the registration papers. All heifers must have been owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor since June 1, present year. Senior yearling and cows, owned since January 1, present year.
- I. Grooming of Livestock...
 - A. Animals will be shown free of any adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products.
 - B. Any compounds that have adhesive qualities that when applied cannot be combed or brushed through or alter the color of the animal are forbidden.
 - C. Alcohol, water, oil, foam or any water-or-alcohol based products with no adhesive or glue qualities, or artificial colorings are permitted.
- J. Complications are subject to review and decision by the Beef Committee and Junior Fair Board.
- K. Superintendent may break classes if the number of animals in class warrants, with the approval of the General Livestock Superintendent and Junior Fair Board.
- L. Tie outs – Pull bedding away from the fence before release on Sunday. STRAW ONLY FOR TIE OUT BEDDING. Gates and posts need to be pulled Sunday morning. No tying to South Fence.
- M. Warts or any other contagious disease will result in disqualification.
- N. There will be only one fan per animal. Generators are encouraged.
- O. When entering the cow /calf class, if the cow is registered purebred and the calf is registered as a plus or percentage, therefore not purebred of that breed then the cow /calf pair shows in the AOB cow/calf class. If the cow or calf isn't registered then it would show in commercial cow/calf class.

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Bred and Owned Heifer Show - Junior Fair

Limit one entry per exhibitor; place your entry on the Junior Fair entry form. No entry fee for this class. Placings will be paid by LaSalle County Stockman at the conclusion of the class.

To qualify for the bred and owned class, the dam of the heifer needs to have been in the name of the exhibitor, sibling, parent, or grandparent at the time of breeding. To participate in this class, the heifer needs to be registered or have proof of being born and raised on the family farm in LaSalle County. To be eligible to show in this class, you need to have shown in either the 4-H or Junior Fair show.

This Class is being sponsored by Triple C Livestock. To qualify for this class, the cow needs to have been in the name of the exhibitor, sibling, parent, or grandparent at the time of breeding. The calf needs to be registered at the time of the show. To be eligible to show in this class, you need to have shown in either the 4-H or Junior Fair show.

Junior Fair Market Beef

RULES

- A. Read all Junior show General Eligibility Rules.
- B. Animals must have been born on or between Jan. 1, and Dec. 31, past year.
- C. In making entry, denote market beef and breed, the superintendent will assign class number by weight of the animal.
- D. Animals must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor beginning on or before Feb. 1, present year.
- E. Exhibitors must show their own animal unless they have two in the same class. The second animal must be shown by another Junior.
- F. **All entries in the Market Beef classes must have been weighed in at an U of I sponsored beef weigh in.**
- G. First and second place winners will show for Breed & Crossbred Champion and Reserve Champion.
- H. Breed & Crossbred Champions and Reserve Champions will show for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion.
- I. This is a no fit show. Refer to the grooming section above for exact rules.

Limit one entry per Exhibitor. Place your entry on the Junior Fair entry form. No entry fee for this class. Placings will be paid by LaSalle County Stockman at the conclusion of the class. To qualify for the LaSalle County Bred Steer class, the steer needs to have been born, raised, or purchased in LaSalle County. If the steer is non papered, they might be asked to provide proof that it was born or raised in LaSalle County by the producer. To be eligible to show in this class, you need to have shown in either the 4-H or Junior Fair show.

Awards: Trophy & Monetary awards donated by LaSalle County Stockman's Association.

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Showmanship

Showmanship will begin at 8:30 am on Saturday. The order will be:

Young Adult (19-20 years old)
Senior (14-18 years old)
Intermediate (11-13 years old)
Junior (8-10 years of age)

Ages are the exhibitor's age as of September 1st of the prior year. Showmanship classes are only open to the youth who showed an animal in that species. Exhibitors need to show in their age group and sit out 1 year if the exhibitor won the previous year. An exemption would be if the exhibitor advances to the next age group because of age. Showmanship has no entry fee or premiums. **Sign up for Showmanship the day of the show.**

Beef Costume Class - Junior Fair Class Only

Bring your decorated beef animal and yourself to the show arena. This is a no entry fee. No premium class. This can be an individual or group. Must be a beef exhibitor to take part in this class. No Cloverbuds can be part of the group. A traveling trophy will be presented.

 - e. Spring Yearling Calved March 1, 2025 to May 31, 2025
 - f. Winter Yearling Calved Dec. 1, 2024 February 28, 2025
 - g. Fall Yearling Calved Sept. 1, 2024 through Nov. 30, 2024

 - i. Aged Cows Calved prior to Sept. 1, 2022
4. Yearling heifers that have calved must show in cow class.
5. No bulls or steers will be shown in the dairy show.
6. First and second place winners of respective age groups will show for Junior and Senior Champion and Reserve Champion in each breed.
7. Champions and Reserve Champions will show for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion of each breed.

All dates, times, and activities are subject to change or cancellation.

8. Registration papers will be checked at the stall on Friday. The exhibitor is responsible for being in the stall area at the time to be designated for this procedure. Ownership (as indicated on registration papers) must be in accordance with the following rules:

- Calves since June 1, present year.
- Yearlings since March 1, present year.
- Cows since January 1, present year.

Registration papers must be available during Junior Fair for inspection.

9. Showmanship. All dairy exhibitors are eligible. Showmanship classes are only open to the youth who showed an animal in that species. There will be three classes. Junior division is for 8 to 13 years old. Senior is for 14 years to 18 years old. Young Adult is for 19 to 20 years of age. Ages are the exhibitor's age as of September 1st of the prior year. Exhibitors need to show in their age group and sit out 1 year if the exhibitor won the previous year. An exemption would be if the exhibitor advances to the next age group because of age. Showmanship has no entry fee or premiums. **Sign up for Showmanship the day of the show.**

10. **Showmanship classes will be the first classes of the day.**

B. Stallions, donkeys and mules are not eligible for entry.

C. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two different animals.

D. Exhibitors showing more than one horse should designate on the entry form which horse is to be shown in each class. Animals need not be registered to exhibit. No animal may be shown by more than one exhibitor and no exhibitor may enter more than one animal in any class.

E. If a horse rider combo enters walk/trot classes on Saturday they must enter walk/trot classes on Sunday.

F. Horse/Rider combination entered in walk/trot classes may not enter any riding classes outside of walk/trot.

G. Either Western or English tack and attire may be used in Showmanship, Equitation, Production and Trail Classes. **Long Pants required.** Helmets and cowboy boots are required for anyone riding a horse IN and OUTSIDE of the arena. Sunday's show is more casual, you may wear Western or English show attire or T-shirts and jeans. **No tank tops allowed during the shows.**

H. Showmanship classes will be judged on showing of the horse in the ring, appearance of animal and appearance of the exhibitor – not the conformation of the animal.

I. All exhibitors must show their animals without assistance, except handicapped riders.

J. Age of exhibitor is determined by age as of September 1st of the prior year.

K. Horses shown on Sunday MUST be shown in at least one class on Saturday.

N. Only exhibitors in the horse show may ride horses during the Fair.

O. All animals must be checked in by the show committee no later than 4:00 p.m. on Thursday.

P. Animal Release is Sunday after 4 pm **and** the stalls are cleaned then inspected by a member of the horse committee. All animals must be removed by 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.

Q. NO Hay bags are to be left in the stall overnight.

R. Horse Ownership/Lease Papers with pictures are required to show in the Junior Show. Please bring the form with you at the time of making entries. Deadline for turning in the forms is the last date that Junior Fair entries are accepted. By turning your forms into Junior Fair, this does NOT make you eligible for the Illinois State 4-H Horse Show. If forms are turned into the Extension Office by their deadline for the LaSalle County 4-H Horse Show, you will not need to submit a copy to Junior Fair.

S. NO classes can be added after your entries have been processed. If you decide to drop a class during the fair, there is a form at the announcer stand that you must fill out and turn in to the people working the announcer stand before the class starts. You may not re-enter after you have turned in the drop a class form.

T. Animals need to be put away before night attractions begin or at the discretion of superintendents and Junior Fair.

U. Refusal to cooperate and abide by barn rules may result in your forfeiture of any awards and premiums earned and/or your DQ from showing at the fair.

- ◆ Your birds must have been Owned/Cared for by May 1st of the current year.
- ◆ Exhibitors must be present to show birds and eggs. If you are not present, your entry will not be judged.
- ◆ Eggs: Exhibitors are allowed to enter one dozen eggs per color variety. More details under class description.
- ◆ You may not exceed **two** entries per individual bird class, **two** entries in any pair class or **one** entry in the trio meat production class.
- ◆ Birds shown in individual classes may compose a part of a pair or trio exhibit.
- ◆ All pair classes will consist of 1 female and 1 male, and must be of the same breed and color.
- ◆ Only the Meat Production classes (broilers or turkeys) are shown as trios: 3 females or 3 males.
- ◆ If there are not enough birds to fill a class, the Livestock Superintendent and Junior Fair Board reserves the right to combine classes.

→ Age Limitations:

- ◆ Young birds (Pullets/Cockerels)- Hatched after September 1st of previous year.
- ◆ Aged birds- Hatched prior to September 1st of previous year.

→ Check-in

- ◆ All birds over 4 months old MUST have a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days prior to the fair. Proof of test must be provided on check-in day. Waterfowl, Pigeons and Quail are exempt from this test.
- ◆ Birds under 4 months require a Hatching Pullorum Clean Certificate from the hatchery.
- ◆ Exhibitors must place birds in their assigned pens.
- ◆ Water cups, feeders and shavings will be provided. You are responsible for feeding, watering and checking on your birds twice a day and must supply your own feed.

→ Final Fair Day

- ◆ Exhibitors are responsible for the cleaning of their bird's pens before they can be released.
- ◆ Birds may not be removed until after 4 pm, and no later than 6:00 pm, on the Final Sunday of the Fair.
- ◆ Fowl removed from pens, or from the fairgrounds, before release time will forfeit all premiums in the department and will relinquish any trophies or other honors received.

ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
2026 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements for
Illinois County Fairs

I. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present on County Fairgrounds, including livestock that are not entered in competitive events. Species specific information follows the general requirements.
2. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits.
3. All out-of-state animals must have an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.
4. All animals, except as noted in species specific information below, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI).
5. All animals must be officially identified.
6. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to County Fairgrounds. Examination may include but is not limited to ultrasound, urine testing, blood testing, and similar actions.
7. Definitions, abbreviations, and administration:
 - a. The Illinois Department of Agriculture may be referred to as "Department" or "IDOA"
 - b. The Department contains a Bureau of Animal Health and Welfare, which receives all CVIs.
 - c. Department or IDOA staff, as used in this document, includes all Bureaus
8. IDOA will continue to monitor state and federal trends in animal health as it relates to this document. Any updates to these requirements will be posted on our website.

II. CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) means a legible record, made on an official form from the state of origin, containing an accurate description or identification of the animal including age, sex, breed, health status, and vaccination information.
2. The CVI must be signed, dated, and issued by a licensed and accredited veterinarian in that state.
3. Submitted CVIs must be as originally issued by the veterinarian; no CVIs with alterations, edits, or changes, will be accepted. The CVI must show that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois (species specific information noted later in this guidance)
4. CVI must show the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor.
5. CVI must include the animal's Animal Identification Number.
 - a. Animal identification number (AIN): A numbering system for the official identification of individual animals in the United States that provides a nationally unique identification number for each animal. The AIN consists of 15 digits, with the first 3 being the country code (840 for the United States or a unique country code for any U.S. territory that has such a code and elects to use it in place of the 840 code).

6. If one CVI is used for multiple animals, each animal identification must be made on a separate line.
7. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to obtain electronic CVIs whenever possible; IDOA is moving toward only accepting electronic CVIs.
8. Exhibitors shall make CVIs available to Department of Agriculture and County Fair staff on request.
 - a. If an official electronic CVI is utilized, the exhibitor should be able to log on and show County Fair staff or Bureau of Animal Health and Welfare Personnel the completed CVI.
9. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
10. CVIs for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
11. CVIs for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.

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III. QUARANTINE AND REMOVAL

1. Quarantine shall be at the animal owner (or exhibitor) risk and expense.
2. Quarantine and removal from the Fairgrounds shall be as determined appropriate by the County Fair Veterinarian, State Veterinarian, or their designee(s).
3. Quarantine will be required until the animal has been properly treated and recovered, or the animal can be released to return to the owner's premise, both in the opinion of the County Fair Veterinarian, State Veterinarian, or their designee(s).
4. Any animal presenting with a condition that would subject it to quarantine must be withdrawn from any/all entered competitions and are not permitted to exhibit.
5. Any condition meriting quarantine may also result in required removal of the animal from the Fairgrounds, as determined appropriate by the County Fair Veterinarian, State Veterinarian, or their designee(s).
6. Conditions subject to quarantine (not an exhaustive list)
 - a. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be held in quarantine.
 - b. Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination
 - c. Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses
 - d. Suspicion of or diagnosis of a foreign animal disease, emerging animal disease, or other actionable disease, animals may be subject to quarantine on the fairgrounds until such time that it is determined that the disease is no longer a threat.
7. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry back into the state.

IV. SPECIES SPECIFIC INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

The information included below for any species is in addition to the requirements noted above. There are no additional species-specific information or requirements for llamas, pigeons, or rabbits.

CATTLE

All dates, times, and activities are subject to change or cancellation.

NO alcoholic beverages, smoking, weapons, or dogs allowed on the 4-H Fairgrounds.

Identification: Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically. Illinois Cattle:

- Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State and an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Brucellosis and Tuberculin testing are not required for Illinois cattle.

- Illinois calves under 6 months of age are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle:

- Brucellosis

1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:

- a. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.

- b. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.

- c. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified).

- d. Animal is a steer or spayed heifer.

2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

- Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

- a. No tuberculin test required.

2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)

3. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.

4. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

ALL **DAIRY CATTLE**(In-State and Out-of-State):

A rRT-PCR test for Influenza A virus (IAV) on milk from lactating dairy cattle present at county fairs shall be conducted prior to livestock arriving on the fairgrounds. The animals must be sampled no more than seven (7) days prior to the date of arrival, and a negative test record must be presented to Department staff.

SWINE

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Illinois Swine:

Brucellosis and Pseudorabies testing are not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine:

- Brucellosis

1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds unless exempt by one (1) of the following:

- a. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.

- b. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.

2. Swine brucellosis tests shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

All dates, times, and activities are subject to change or cancellation.

NO alcoholic beverages, smoking, weapons, or dogs allowed on the 4-H Fairgrounds.

- Pseudorabies

1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within 10 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.
4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification • Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

- Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. If the tattoos are not visible, another form of official identification must be presented.
- When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

3 Market Lambs:

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

Scrapie:

Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.

CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification:

- Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.
- Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. If the tattoos are not visible, another form of official identification must be presented.
 - o Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.
- When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Scrapie:

Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan. CVI must include the herd of birth and the herd of origin, if different.

All dates, times, and activities are subject to change or cancellation.

NO alcoholic beverages, smoking, weapons, or dogs allowed on the 4-H Fairgrounds.

Out-of-State Goats:

Goats from states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must also have the following information included on their CVI:

1. That the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and
2. The individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Equine Infectious Anemia

- All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older entering the Fairgrounds, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months.
- A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.

Illinois Equine:

A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine:

All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

POULTRY

1. All entries (except chickens under 4 m/o old, pigeons & waterfowl, i.e., domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitors shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the State Veterinarian or their designee or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be removed from exhibition and must be removed from the Fairgrounds.
5. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the Fair will be removed from the Fairgrounds.
6. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.

CERVIDAE: Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other Related Species

Identification: All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique

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identifiers.

Illinois Cervidae:

- Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD): For cervidae moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Illinois Department of Agriculture prior to movement. The cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- a) Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- b) Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number;
- c) Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- d) Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

- Tuberculosis: Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cervidae.

Out-of-State Cervidae:

All Cervidae entering Illinois must:

1. Be in compliance with the Illinois Wildlife Code [520 ILCS 5]. For more information, contact the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at 217/782-6384.
2. Be accompanied by a permit from the Illinois Department of Agriculture
3. Have a CVI that:
 - a. shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the past five years);
 - b. shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or communicable disease;
 - c. shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.
4. Brucellosis: Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

5. Tuberculosis

- a. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States: All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) tests for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds. These animals shall be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.

1. Cervidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
2. Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.

- b. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)

1. All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was

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conducted within the past year.

2. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional TB tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds.

RATITES: Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis

Illinois Ratites:

There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

Out-of-State Ratites:

1. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.

2. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry onto the Fairgrounds. For clarification or additional information on health requirements, contact:
