## STEPHENSON COUNTY 4-H INFORMATION:



### BEEF WEIGH IN

The time is fast approaching to weigh your 2021 Beef projects. Beef Weigh-In will be held at the **Lena Vet Clinic** just south of Lena on Hwy 73. This year's Weigh-In is scheduled for **Saturday, February 6 from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m.** The scheduled snow date is Saturday, February 13 from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m.

Please arrive at the site according to your scheduled time. In order to better facilitate the unloading and reloading of trailers, please enter the Vet Clinic from the west, off of Goddard Rd. To get to Goddard Road, you will need to go one mile west of the intersection of Hwy. 20 and Hwy. 73 to Five Corners Rd. At Five Corners Rd., turn north, and then proceed for one mile to Goddard Rd., turn east to get to the veterinary clinic entrance. **By entering from this direction the line-up of trucks and trailers on Hwy. 73 will be eliminated, thereby alleviating the potential for a very dangerous situation.**

The Lena Vet Clinic will be offering a variety of vaccinations at the time of weigh-in, for those interested. Please do not feel that you must utilize any of the Lena Vet Clinic services; it is not a requirement, it's only offered as a service if you're interested.

**If you will be weighing any beef cattle, please take time to complete the enclosed electronic registration link below and return it to us by 8 am on Friday, February 5.** This is **required** for registration and participation in the Beef Weigh-In, and allows us to accurately prepare for the day. Additionally, you must be registered as a 4-H member in 4-H Online. You can register for your 4-H membership in 4-H Online at : <https://v2.4honline.com/>

Please register by FAMILY and be sure to list your CELL phone number in the Daytime Phone slot

We are hoping to eliminate as much contact as we can and be as safe as possible, so the following safety measures will be in place for beef weigh-in.

-No extra people will be allowed. Only the exhibitor of the animal that is currently being processed OR one parent/guardian will be allowed out of their vehicles at a time. NOT BOTH.

-Only the exhibitor OR one parent/guardian will be allowed in the "processing" area at a time.

-Everyone must wear a mask.

\* If you are planning on exhibiting your steer at the 2021 Illinois State Fair, those steers must be electronically tagged along with the usual tattoo procedure. There is no charge for the electronic tag and you will receive it on weigh-in day.

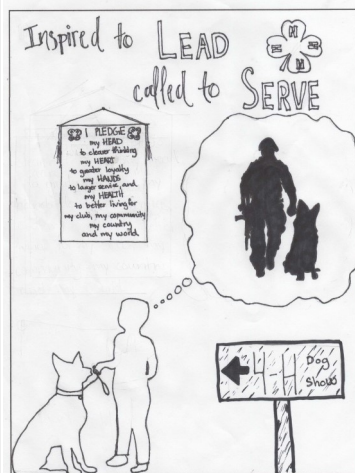

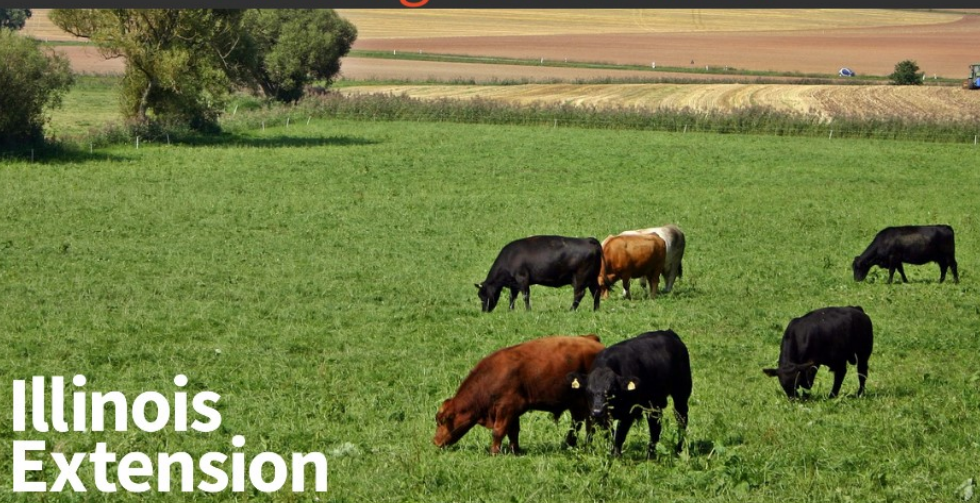
