Keynote Address

The Beautiful Way to Improve **Water Quality** Presented by: **Eliana Brown**

Eliana is a Water Quality Specialist with IISG and Illinois Extension. She has a Master's degree in Environmental Engineering from University of Illinois where she worked as the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Coordinator. She is also a LEED AP, a certified Master Gardener, and she recently passed the National Green Infrastructure Certification Program. Brown is involved with the implementation of the Illinois Nutrient Loss Reduction Strategy. Her areas of expertise are the regulatory aspects of wastewater and storm water programs and green infrastructure.

During her presentation on "The Beautiful Way to Improve Water Quality" Eliana will focus on how to have healthy landscapes that help local waterways without sacrificing aesthetics. Topics that will be discussed include sustainable lawn care, rain gardens, and native plants and how to integrate them into your existing landscape beautifully.
