- An exhibitor may show up to 2 market animals per weight class (light, medium, heavy). If more than one animal belonging to an individual exhibitor is designated for a particular weight class, another Clinton County 4-H member must show the additional entries in that class.

- Cats are not eligible for the Illinois State Fair.



POULTRY

Show Rules

- Exhibitors may show no more than two (2) entries per class.
- Remember to dust your birds for lice once a month, through July. Please establish a routine for checking and treating for lice and mites NOW.
- A broiler-fryer market pen consists of three cockerels or three pullets of the same breed each weighing between 3 and 4 pounds inclusive.
- A roaster market pen consists of three cockerels or three pullets of the same breed weighing over 4 pounds.
- A Wild Game permit is required for game birds (pheasant, quail, etc.). Can be obtained from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

Ownership

- Owned by Exhibitor by June 1.
- All eggs must be raised by exhibitor. Store bought eggs are NOT allowed and will disqualified.


