Let's Make it Official

Remember, no one is "officially" part of 4-H until they're approved on <u>4-H Online</u> – and that goes for leaders, too! Be sure that your family gets enrolled so you don't miss out on any 4-H fun! The <u>Family Enrollment Guide</u> walks you through the whole process.

Note: Some families have been struggling with credit card payments on 4-H online. We recommend that you delete any stored CC info and re-enter prior to payment. You can find instructions to do so <u>HERE</u>.

The 4-H program fee will remain at \$20 per youth participant, with a family cap of \$60. However, no one will be denied membership due to inability to pay. If you need a fee waiver, complete THIS FORM and return it to your local Extension Office.


You can also request the books or curriculum for projects that you've enrolled in at https://go.illinois.edu/FMPTPubs. Books that come as hard copies are \$2 each.

4-H State Robotics Challenge Spacebot: Mission Command

This year's Illinois 4-H Robotics competition will revolve around the work of the 4-H in Space Mission Command Team, which is preparing curriculum and programming options for Illinois youth working with the International Space Station National Laboratories (ISS) and The Lab for Advanced Space Systems at Illinois, Dept. of Aerospace Engineering, (LASSI). These collaborations will enable Illinois 4-H youth to send experiments to the ISS, and build/ launch micro satellites into orbit.

The SpaceBot Mission Command Challenge will take place at the McLean County Fairgrounds in Bloomington, IL on Saturday, April 16, 2022. Team registration will open January 17, 2022 and will close March 16, 2022. There will be a \$20 Entry fee per team assessed at the time of registration.

Club Activity Opportunity!

Bring an engaging, hands-on activity to your next club meeting...and introduce your kids to the brand new Cover Crop Science 4-H project. Matthew Hagaman, one of the Cover Crop Science project book authors, would love to visit your club! Activities are free for clubs (thanks to a USDA grant) and last about 20 minutes—though times are flexible. Some of the activities he offers include...

- Engineering a Cover Crop Harvester: Conduct experiments & compare/contrast results to engineer a model plant harvester.
- **Cover Crop Life Cycles:** Work with plant materials to sequence the life cycle of a pennycress plant.
- Making Cover Crop Ink: Experiment with materials to discover how to make an ink, including oil, water, and an emulsifier.
- Gene Editing with LEGOs: Examine parts of 2 different pennycress plants, then use LEGOs to understand the process of working with DNA to improve crops.
