COVID update for in-person events:

In line with the latest guidelines from the University, the following protocol will be effective immediately for all of our events:

- Illinois Extension will no longer require fully vaccinated people to wear face coverings or practice social distancing indoors or outdoors at our events. "Fully vaccinated" means 14 days after your final dose.
- Face coverings for youth under 12 and people who are not fully vaccinated will be required indoors during events, within the defined event space. For outdoor events, masks may be removed within the event space only when it is possible to maintain a social distance of at least 6 feet.
- These policies are grounded in the honor code and Extension staff will not verify the vaccination status of staff, youth, families, or volunteers.

We will keep aligning with the Centers for Disease Control, Illinois Department of Public Health, and University of Illinois guidelines and will update you on any changes.
