Results Unit-Wide Policies

It is important for you to review the **Unit-Wide policies** and to become familiar with them. If a **deadline** lands on a weekend, the paperwork needs to be turned in to the drop box by Monday before 7:59 a.m.

- **December 1**st- Re-enrollment deadline & College Contract deadline. The step-by-step guide will be emailed to you once ZSuite opens.
- If you were a member last year, and you missed the December 1, 2021 re-enrollment deadline, you will not be eligible to participate in the 2023 4-H shows at the fair.
- The \$20 program fee is required. We will invoice your 4-H club; pay your 4-H Club or work with them on your 4-H Club's payment arrangement.
- Members will need to attend at least four meetings a year to be eligible to participate in your county's 4-H fair. You must be physically present at the 4-H meeting or logged in and attending via a Zoom option. Excused absences do not count as attending.
- At minimum members must complete a talk or demonstration. However, clubs may require both.
- Secretaries are required to send attendance sheets monthly after their meeting to the Extension Office. This can
 be shared by Google Docs, email, scanned, mailed, or dropped off. We ask that you use the online Secretary book;
 you can either save it electronically or print it from your computer. We ask 4-H Leaders to review your secretary
 attendance sheet monthly before the office receiving them.
- Treasurers need to make sure they are balancing accounts monthly and providing reports during each meeting. Also, make sure you are using the required online form. For the new 2022-2023 4-H year, Treasurers need to start with the ending balance of the prior 4-H year fiscal report. (Please ask questions if needed)
- January 1 All Livestock Project enrollment deadline (Cat, Cattle, Chicken, Dog, Goat, Horse, Poultry, Rabbit, and Sheep). This is the last date you may add **ANY livestock** project and still be eligible to show that project at the county 4-H fair. Again, you may add this online.
- March 1 General Project enrollment deadline. This is the last date you may add a general project and still be eligible to show that project at the county 4-H fair. Remember that you already turned in your project enrollment when you enrolled in ZSuite. However, if you need to add a general show project, you may do so before this deadline. This is where you tell us what projects you want to learn more about!
- May 1—Horse project member's ownership/lease paperwork and pictures due to the office.
- May 1 Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) yearly certification is required of all livestock project members (aside from cats, dogs, and horses). If you plan to show livestock at the county and/or state fair, this is now a state requirement. Ask your local extension office about ways to complete this training online or in person. For non-food-producing animals (cats, dogs, and horses), QAEC will still be required by May 1 for those who have not completed it.
- June 1- Dog project member's ownership/lease paperwork and pictures due to the office.
- 4 Weeks Before Fair -Entries are due online by 11:59 p.m in FairEntry. Please keep in mind that staff cannot help you after hours that day. It is suggested that you have the entries completed online before office closing at 4:00 p.m. that day. Just because you enroll in a project doesn't mean you are automatically entered in the fair. Late entries will not be accepted. Please make sure you complete your online entries. This is where you tell us what projects you plan to bring. Watch the newsletter and the 4-H Facebook page for dates where you can stop in and get help with entries. https://fairentry.com/

If at any time you have questions, please contact your local extension office and the 4-H staff will be happy to visit with you. Deadline reminders will be made via the Hilite and Social Media pages. The 4-H staff is excited for the new 4-H year and supports your adventures in the 4-H program.

What Does It Mean?

Have you ever heard a term in 4-H and thought what does that mean? We are here to help! 4-H is an amazing youth program that has been active for over 100 years. In some families, 4-H is a tradition they pass on to the next generation with excitement. Some families are starting their 4-H journey for the first time this year. To help better understand our "4-H lingo" we have provided a terms list in each green folder for our new 4-H families. You will receive them during your first 4-H meeting. We are also going to highlight a few each newsletter, as different terms will be used more frequently at different times of the year.

SPIN Club: Special Interest Club. In these clubs, members meet to learn about one specific topic, such as robotics or shooting sports.

Multi Project Club: In the past this has been referred to as a "Community Club" or a "Traditional Club." This is the club that meets monthly with members who have many different interests and are enrolled in livestock projects and/or general projects.

New 4-H Enrollment & Registration System Coming this Fall!

Illinois 4-H is switching our enrollment and registration system from 4-H Online to ZSuite this fall. We believe this new system will offer a more user-friendly experience and features that will help you stay connected to the 4-H program and find new exciting experiences and opportunities for your kids! Registration will open in this new system in mid-October. Look for emails from your local 4-H staff at that time with directions on how to get your family set up in the new system.
