SNAP-Ed Update for Boone County

Mid May concluded nutrition education programs for the school districts. Successes include programming for all grade levels at Perry Elementary School, a high needs school. We also did a school garden at Perry which we will continue gardening and nutrition lessons for the months leading up to the next school year. Upcoming summer programs will include IL Jr Chef cooking schools for youth, CATCH programming at the Belvidere Family Y and Perry Gardens, adult programming at community meals, farmers market wellness fair, extension office and WIC clinics. Nutrition information is being supplied to the food pantries each month for distribution.

SNAP-Ed Update for DeKalb County

In DeKalb County, from February moving forward, I have been conducting OrganWise Guys (OWG) sessions at Malta Elementary, serving a total of 94 students each week with the final session being held last week. I have been conducting virtual Eat, Play, Grow (EPG) sessions with Two Rivers Head Start DeKalb, reaching an average of 30 students per session, with 1-2 sessions being held per month. I also conducted a virtual EPG session with Stepping Stones Pre-K in Rochelle. With the circumstances of the programs being virtual I have prepared and pre-delivered various craft supplies and family handouts that accompany each lesson. I also conducted a virtual EPG session with Stepping Stones Pre-K in Rochelle. I have been conducting Eat, Move, Save (EMS) Booths at various locations including the Salvation Army Food Panty in DeKalb and the Mt. Morris Senior Center. I have been collaborating with Barb Food Mart on a grant that they were awarded. Within the circumstances of the grant I have been providing demo videos that are attached to a recipe card via QR Code, along with SNAP-Ed printed resources that they have included into a meal kit box for their patrons. In addition, I have been working with them on a summer collaboration, as they have asked me to provide EMS Booth services with food samples and Direct Education (DE) in a variety of curriculums. I have secured a reservation for a week of DE at the Farm Bureau in DeKalb in which I will be hosting an Illinois Junior Chefs program. I have been working with Youth Services Bureau to provide DE using the EPG curriculum. I have secured a week with their location as well, to host an Illinois Junior Chefs program, in which a waiting list has already been started. I also secured Illinois Junior Chefs programs with Trinity Lutheran Church in Mt. Morris, and have begun planning CATCH sessions for their free summer lunch program. I have been collaborating on the Growing Together Illinois Project as well, in which the University of Illinois Extension has secured a grant that works to connect different departments of our organization as well as community partners. We have been able to offer a large supply of fresh produce to a variety of food pantries in our service area, do to this project.
