

Monroe County Extension & 4-H Education Foundation Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established in February 2002 by memorial funds from the family and friends of Wilbert Sensel. Additional contributions continue to support the scholarship.

The scholarship will help young people enrich their lives through continuing their education.

The scholarship award is up to \$1,500 per recipient.

Application Criteria

- Applicants must be seniors in high school and/or have not reached their nineteenth birthday on or before September 1, 2021.
- Applicants must have been enrolled and active in a 4-H club program for at least the last **four** consecutive years.
- The applicant must be a resident of Monroe County and/or reside in the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer or Red Bud School districts.
- 4-H members can only receive the Scholarship once.
- Applicants **must** be accepted into or be attending a post-high school education program.
- Applicants must submit **two** character references *with application*.
 - one reference from your 4-H club leader
 - one from another source (i.e. teacher, Extension staff, etc.)
- The application **must be signed by the applicant**. (Electronic Signature Accepted)
- Completed applications **must be emailed, dropped off or postmarked by April 15, 2022** to:

 - University of Illinois Extension, P. O. Box 117, Waterloo, IL 62298
- Recipients **must provide** information on the Office of Student Financial Aid Form where the scholarship check will be sent.
- Recipients agree to submit a summary of career achievements following the first year of post-high school education.

Participation in 4-H Events/Activities	Applicant provides details about the skills that they have learned through 4-H events and activities that will be helpful in their future career (i.e leadership, community service, knowledge/skills gained, advancement in involvement.)	50
Academic Plans	Applicant explains how this scholarship will help achieve their career goals.	20
Tell Your 4-H Story	Applicant explains how they got started in 4-H and why they remained active. Applicant also describes the beneficial elements of the 4-H program.	50
Completed Application	Complete and accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar are evident.	10
Recommendation Letters	Two recommendation letters are provided by applicant.	10
