Applications must include the following:

- 1. Completion of this document, the Scholar Application Template. This includes a personal statement that emphasizes the applicant's abilities and interests and the applicant's expectations of the program (800 words or less).
- 2. Personal and academic curriculum vitae (two pages or less using 12-point font).
- 3. Two letters of professional recommendation, including one from the student's major professor. If no major professor exists, the faculty member who is most familiar with the applicant academically may be substituted. A template for the reference letter is available on the ISP website.
- 4. Copies of graduate student transcripts. Unofficial copies will be accepted.
- 5. Submit the application as one pdf to <u>uie-connection@illinois.edu</u> (Application template, personal statement, vitae. Transcripts can be sent separately. Letters of reference must be sent separately directly from your reference.)
