

Livestock Ethics Trainings

The animal ethics trainings are *required*. There are two different trainings. Please follow the rules for the one that fits the type of animal you show. If you plan to show animals in both categories, you are required to complete both trainings.

QAEC - for cats, dogs, horses, poultry & rabbits. This training is only required ONCE per 4-H career. It is free and can be accessed here:

YQCA - for cattle, goats, sheep & swine

This training is required once per YEAR. It is \$12 to complete online at <u>vqcaprogram.org</u>. Remember that this is a new website as of last spring. In person trainings are being discussed.

We will be holding an in-person YQCA training on **Wednesday**, **March 8** in the Milan Office at 6 p.m. To register, you must log-in to yqcaprogram.org, select the training, and pay \$3. The payment must be done via the YQCA website in advance. We cannot do it for you and we cannot accept cash. Please complete this process by Monday, March 6.

State Fair Entry Deadlines

Horses—Ownership/Lease/Registration papers due to county office by **May 1, 2023** with pictures of each side of the horse. State Fair entry forms due to state fair office by **June 1.** State Fair entry forms must include a copy of the ownership/lease/ registration papers and pictures.

Livestock—Entries due to the state fair office by **July 1**. Office <u>will not</u> accept late entries.

State Fair Market Animals

Premiere Barrows: Must be weighed and tattooed between February 10 and April 15, 2023. Pigs must be tattooed within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1lb/day of age. Contact the Extension Office to set up a tattoo date.

Market Wethers, Ewe Lambs & Meat Goat Wethers:

Must self-nominate between March 15 and May 15, 2023. Nomination forms available through Extension Office and require a picture showing Scrapie ID tag affixed in animals' ear.

Scholarships

RI Bert Blood Scholarship

The Rock Island County Extension & 4-H Education Foundation and the Rock Island Rotary Club are co- sponsoring college/ trade school scholarships for 4-H members and alumni. Eligibility: Rock Island County 4-H members who are seniors in high school and plan to attend college or trade school in the fall of 2023 are eligible to apply for one of three scholarships that will be awarded in the amounts of \$1,500, \$1,250 and \$1,000. Rock Island County 4-H alumni who will be enrolled as sophomores, juniors and seniors in college or trade school in the fall of 2023, and that have at least a 3.0 grade point average, can apply for one of two \$500 scholarships (Note: past winners of the high school senior scholarships can apply for the alumni scholarship. Past winners of the alumni scholarship are not eligible to win again).

The application process:

Scholarship application, high school or college transcript, and two reference forms are due by **Monday, March 20**, 2023. They can either be submitted through the online

2023. They can either be submitted through the online application process or dropped off or mailed to the Rock Island County Extension office.

All scholarship checks will be made out to the college or trade school to which the winners are enrolled.

The three high school winners will be invited to attend a scholarship luncheon sponsored by the Rock Island Rotary Club to be held on Tues. April 11 from 11:30 am – 1 pm at the Quad City Botanical Center where they will receive notification of their award amount and have the opportunity to share a brief speech about their 4-H experiences.

Patti Jeanne Higgins 4-H Scholarship

This scholarship is for one year, available to high school seniors or persons enrolled in the first year of college, university, technical, or vocational school. Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded each year. Applicant must be a resident of Mercer or Warren County. Applicant must have been actively involved in 4-H for a minimum of three years. Preference will be given to applicants who are or were a member of the Alexis All-Star 4-H Club. Applicant is required to verify acceptance to or present enrollment at a college or university prior to receiving the grant. Applicant shall be required to submit a written application. In addition to eligibility guidelines, the following will be considered in selecting recipients: Academic performance and honors Rank in class ACT score Financial need Character and personality: Consideration shall be given to maturity; industriousness and motivation; intellectual interest; moral character; and demonstrated leadership.
