



Game day is May 20 at 6:15 p.m. against the LA Dodgers.


SUMMER 2023



Regional 4-H Horse Bowl and Hippology


The Regional 4-H Horse Bowl and Hippology contest was held Saturday, March 25 at SIUC. Congratulations to all that competed!




