# PLANT A ROW, WATCH COPE GROW FOOD DONATION GARDEN



## **Our Story**

In our third year of growing at the garden, we continued to grow produce to combat food insecurity in Metropolis. With funding support from a Growing Together Illinois fund, we implemented garden improvements at the Plant a Row, Watch COPE Grow Food Donation Garden. Growing Together Illinois is funded by University of Illinois Extension's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education. We continued our partnership with COPE Food Pantry to deliver all produce grown at the garden for distribution at the pantry.

Massac agriculture students built and installed new raised beds to replace the former rotted beds. Max Russell brought his tractor to fill the new beds with compost. Volunteers helped tend the garden on workdays. Seven sponsors donated time, supplies, and funding to support the project.

We grew a total of 352.3 pounds of produce this year. We grew potatoes and bok choy for the first time and included storage and cooking instructions, as well as recipes, for vegetables that may be less familiar to the pantry's clientele.

39 volunteer hours were recorded - a \$1,113 value














# 352.3 pounds of produce were grown in 2021
