Approval of the November 9, 2022 and the February 15, 2023 meeting minutes were tabled due to not having a quorum present.

#### **Extension Updates – County Director:**

Jordee informed the council that in March the Unit brought on a new 4-H EPC for Bond County and currently the Unit is fully staffed in 4-H, but effective August 1, the Clinton County EPC will be taking over the Marion County Horticulture EPC position thereby leaving a void in the Clinton County 4-H EPC position. The hiring process has begun and it is hoped to have someone in that position prior to the 2023 Clinton County Fair so the new candidate could shadow the current 4-H EPC and then take over the duties on August 1.

The Jefferson County Office Support is due to start on Monday, June 12. After that time the unit will be fully staffed in the category of Office Support. The SNAP positions (Educator and 2 Community Outreach Workers) have not been filled and there have been several failed searches. Jordee would like to fill the Educator position first and will continue to work on getting that position filled.

The Educators and Jordee have been going to County Board Meetings in the various counties and giving presentations on what Extension is and what we do.
