The Henry/Stark White Team placed 3rd overall in the senior division with members Avery Knupp, Nolan Orwig, Cole Kinsella, Brayden Hardin and Chet Gillespie. They also won the beef division.

Members also did well individually. Slone Windish was the top of the swine division. Cole Kinsella was 2nd in beef. Kashen Ellerbrock was the top individual in the reasons division and 6th overall. Both teams will be invited to compete at national contests this fall.



Crop scouting is an important skill for anyone dealing with commercial crops that can lead to higher yields and increased profit per acre. This year's competition will be held on **August 1** at the U of I South Farm Fields in Champaign. Teams should consist of 2-5 high school aged youth with an adult coach. There will be 10 outdoor stations with topics such as identifying weeds, insects, diseases, plant growth stages and integrated pest management. - 3. Total cost is \$2,000, but the Illinois 4-H Foundation will pay \$1,500 for each of the 10 delegates.
