Mitchell Memorial Scholarship

July 21st 2008, our club and community suffered a tragic loss. Mike and Kyle Mitchell were killed in an accident on their family dairy farm. The Mitchell family has been a part of the Seward Determination 4-H club for many years. All three of the Mitchell boys have been in the Seward Determination Club.

Mike Mitchell was in 4-H, and was a member of the Westfield Wildcats 4-H club. He was a national honor society member and manager of the Winnebago High School basketball team. He was a fifth generation dairy farmer, active member of the First Presbyterian church, involved in the Midwest Dairyman's company, Illinois Milk Producers association, Boone-Winnebago Holstein club, past board member of the Farm Bureau and a graduate of the Agricultural Leaders of Tomorrow.

Kyle graduated as class valedictorian and was going to be a junior at the University of Illinois majoring in agriculture engineering. His interests included soccer, music and socializing. He was a member of the Junior Holstein association, Inter Varsity Christian Fellowship, Phi Theta Kappa, and Rock Valley College Student Leaders. He attended First Presbyterian Church, serving as youth elder. A statement made by James Burns of Winnebago School district described Kyle as a representative of a very close-knit family that put family first and were very supportive of everyone in the community. Growing up on the family dairy farm instilled the values of hard work, discipline and responsibility in Kyle.

It is our hope that by offering this scholarship, it will ensure that some of the same quality traits that Mike and Kyle embodied will be carried on.
