Clubs with the most creative method of collection AND highest percentage of items collected! 4-H Signage should be present. Collection site should be on display for at least 30 days. Birthday Bags will gift a birthday treat to those who may not be fortunate enough to have those supplies. Suggested items for collection include dry cake mix, frosting, candles,, sprinkles, cupcake liners, etc.



Items collected should be delivered to local Extension office by March 1.



March - April: Animal Shelter Items

Club with highest percentage of items collected and most community partners involved! 4-H signage should be present. Collection site should be on display for at least 30 days. Items to help your local animal shelter should be delivered to local Extension Office by May 1. Items to collect may include: toys, dry or canned pet food, treats, paper towels, puppy pads, cat litter, blankets, etc.

May-July: Stuff the Bus

Club with highest percentage of items collected and most community partners involved! 4-H signage should be present. Collection site should be on display for at least 30 days.

School supplies collected should be delivered to local Extension Office by August 1.

- Have each participating member reach out to 3 businesses and ask them to support your challenge somehow. Let us know who these partners are so we can give them a social media shout out!
