

What are project books?

In 4-H, members learn about topics that interest them. These are referred to as "4-H projects." That could be anything from learning how to cook, build a robot, or care for the environment. One of the most important aspects of 4-H project work is that the 4-H member decides what they want to learn and do as they explore their project. This allows the project to be self-paced and gives children the necessary skills for setting and working toward their goals.

4-H makes learning fun! Various projects are offered through 4-H, so members can pick the ones that most interest them. 4-H projects help members to learn by doing. Projects offer hands-on ways to learn about a topic of interest.

Example: Your 4-Her has enrolled in the Veterinary Science Project. You would order the veterinary science project book 1, 2, or 3.

Are 4-H project books required?

All general projects entered in the General Projects Day or Home and Family Show must be accompanied by the correct project book.

Can Cloverbuds order project books?

No, Cloverbuds work on projects as a group. They will receive a Cloverbud activity book from their club leader.

How much are project books?

Each 4-H Member gets five Project books free of charge. Any project books after five will have a book charge of the amount of the project book.

How do I pay for my extra project books?

By check or cash in the Extension Office. All checks are payable to "Illinois Extension" and must have "4-H members name & project book" written in the memo line.

(Example: Landon-Project Books)





How do I choose my project book level?

There are three levels within a project area. Some projects may have more. Each 4-H member can work at the level that fits their skill level. The recommendation is to begin with level one.

Some projects have several levels. As members master the work at a beginning level, they are encouraged to advance to higher levels. Our Project Selection guide is available for viewing below and our Resource & Curriculum Guide.

When do I move to the next project level?

4-H project books are designed for each member to work independently. If your 4-H member feels ready to move up to the next project level, I would encourage you to speak to your club leader about their thoughts and move them to the next level if it's fitting!

Do I have to move to the next level?

No, 4-H members can stay in the same project level for several years; however, if a member has been in a project area for several years and has mastered the level. I encourage them to move to the next level.

What do I need to do before selecting my project books?

What is ZSuite?

Youth who wish to participate in 4-H and adults serving as volunteers must enroll in the 4-H program through ZSuite. Youth must be enrolled in ZSuite and have their enrollment fee paid to receive project books. In addition, youth must be enrolled in ZSuite to receive the link for ordering project books.

How do I know when my Project Books are ready to be picked up?

You will receive an email once your project books are ready with pick up options and information.

Where do I pick up my project books?
