4-H Enrollment System - ZSuites

ZSuites, the 4-H Enrollment System, is open for families to enroll their members in 4-H. You must be enrolled to attend club meetings, Shooting Sports events or county workshops! If your club isn't paying the \$10 program fee, families can pay online via credit card or families can pay their club leaders. Everyone must be enrolled before they participate in any type of 4-H activity so that they are covered by insurance.

Families need to select a club and at least 1 project when completing the enrollment process. May 1, 2024 is the deadline to add or delete projects for exhibiting at the Shelby County 4-H Fair. Below is the link to Illinois 4-H which has instructions for enrolling. New families will need to follow the New Member Enrollment. Families who are re-enrolling have their own instructions. If you have a 4-H member that you are re-enrolling but also a new member, re-enroll your 4-H member, then you can add a new member to your family. Bank Steer Program

Deadline Friday, November 17

Are you interested in raising, showing and selling a steer as a 4-H project? The Shelby County State Bank is offering interest-free loans to Shelby County 4-H members to assist them in purchasing a steer to exhibit at the fair. In order to be eligible to participate in this program, the 4-H member must have been enrolled in 4-H at least one previous year. Members must complete enrollment in ZSuites. The \$10 program fee must also be submitted to the Extension office by November 17. Note - new families will have an on-farm visit from the Bank Steer Committee prior to steer weigh-in. All participants will have an on-farm visit in the Spring by the Bank Steer Committee. Shelby County State Bank reserves the right to deny any individual participation in the Bank Steer Program.

The deadline to sign up for a bank steer is November 17. Pick-up for steers will be in February at the county steer weigh-in.

Shelby County 4-H Member Policy

If a 4-H member wishes to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H Fair and be eligible to receive premiums, the following items must be completed by the 4-H'er:

- 4-H'er must attend <u>three</u> of their <u>own club</u> meetings. College students must attend two of their own 4-H Club meetings.
- 4-H'er must present a talk or demonstration at their <u>own club</u> meeting. The talk or demonstration must pertain <u>to a 4-H project</u>. It doesn't have to be a project the 4-H'er is enrolled in.
- 4-H'er must participate in a county activity. Examples of a county activity include: 4-H Round-up, Winter Craft Day, 4-H Fire-Up, 4-H Week activities, Spring Cleanup at the fairgrounds, Spring Craft Day, 4-H project workshops, etc.

Project Manuals

- 4-H members may order up to 5 project books at no charge. Over 5 project books will be charged to members at cost. Members need to order books by contacting Yolanda.
 - 4-H members need to be enrolled and paid their \$10 program fee by December 13 to qualify for the early enrollment incentive!

 Enrollment deadline to exhibit at the fair is March 1.
