The Plant a Row, Watch COPE Grow Food Donation Garden is a partnership between University of Illinois Extension and COPE. Established in 2018, the garden has received over \$25,000 in donations and grant funding. Community volunteers have given about 500 hours of time to planting, tending, and harvesting produce. To date we've grown over 1,850 pounds of produce, all donated to COPE.

We had a great spring season this year, with temperatures staying consistently cool. This provided us with a great crop of peas, greens, and root vegetables.



This year, the garden produced 593 pounds of produce, all of which was donated to COPE. Cucumbers were the top producer, with 174 pounds grown! We added snap and snow peas and mustard greens this year, and had our first successful onion crop.
