Dear 2022-2023 Counselor Candidates,

We are very excited to be back to our OVERNIGHT 4-H Camp Week for 2023 and we hope you are too! The dates have been set for **Sunday, June 11- Thursday, June 15, 2023.** We will be attending Rock River Christian Camp in Polo, IL this year!

It's time to begin planning and preparing for the **AWESOME** week we're sure to have. One major piece of this planning process is finding a spectacular team of young adults to turn camp week into a polished and fine-tuned operation! We're thinking **YOU** may be able to help in this effort.

We are now accepting applications to fill 27 counselor positions. 4-H Camp Counselors are classified as 4-H Teen Leaders; therefore, any counselor not currently enrolled in the 4-H program will be expected to register via the ZSuites enrollment system. More details on that process will be forwarded after counselor selections have been made. Candidates should be reliable, energetic, and enthusiastic young adults between the ages of 15 and 20 by the first day of camp (06/11/2023). Counselors do not register for camp; they attend camp for free; however, you will be charged a fee of \$50 for training expenses. Being a camp counselor is serious business, a lot of hard work, and a TON of fun!

So, if you think you are up for the challenge, fill out the enclosed application and two (2) reference forms and return them to one of the offices listed on the back page of the application. The deadline for applications is Wednesday, November 30, 2022, at 4:30 p.m. –This is not a postmarked date; it must be in our hands by this time! The competition is getting tough, so do your best and take the application process seriously!

The Extension Staff will be meeting shortly after the deadline to select the 2023 Counselor Team. Be aware that filling out the application does NOT guarantee you a place on the team. Some things that will be considered in the selection process are effort put into your application, camping experience (4-H or other), references, camp-related skills, childcare experience, leadership experience, 4-H membership, county of residence, age, CIT experience, etc. Letters of acceptance and denial will be mailed to candidates after December 12, 2022.

Counselor Team Members will be expected to participate actively in training between January and June and may be cut from the team if their progress in training is of concern to the Extension Staff. Please see the back page for more information on our counselor training attendance policy.

It is our goal to provide a safe, fun, and educational program for the 150+ campers who participate. We want to feel comfortable that you are ready to help us make this happen before camp starts. We also want you to feel confident enough about your role that camp week is just as fun for you as it will be for the kids you are serving!

We look forward to receiving your counselor application and we are very excited about this year's plans! Please get your application in soon. If you have a friend that you think would be a great counselor, please call us so that we can send him or her the application packet too!

COUNSELOR TRAINING SCHEDULE:

If you decide to pursue the application process for the 4-H Camp Counselor position, you will be expected to <u>actively</u> participate in counselor training. Please put the following dates on your calendar now! <u>Missing counselor training IS a big deal</u>...and the lack of attendance can mean counselors being cut.

Training #1: Saturday, January 7 9:30- 3:30 pm- @ Stephenson County Extension Office- Freeport

Training #2: Thursday, February 9 7:00-9:00 pm- ZOOM @ your nearest participating County Extension Office

Training #3: Saturday, March 11 1:00- 6:00 pm- @ Ogle County Farm Bureau- Oregon

Training #4: Saturday, April 22 9:30-3:30 pm - @ Whiteside County Extension Office- Sterling

Training #5: Friday, June 2- Saturday, June 3 7:00 pm-3:30 pm @ Rock River Christian Camp- Polo (Overnight)

Additionally, counselors may be required to communicate/meet with fellow committee members outside of the regular training schedule to discuss evening program planning.

COUNSELOR TRAINING ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Counselors should make every accommodation to attend **ALL** camp counselor meetings. However, we realize that school and sports events do occur on our training dates, we have the following attendance policy for ALL counselors:

> One free absence is permitted (with staff approval) for 4-H Camp Counselors. Each absence must be <u>preapproved</u> by Extension staff prior to the training date. Any other potential absences <u>must</u> be approved on a case-by-case basis prior to the training date.

It is your responsibility to make every effort to attend trainings. Keep in mind that the counselor team will be stronger if everyone involved helps to build it. Please realize that if you do not follow through on your counselor training commitment, you may be dismissed from the 2023 4-H Camp Counselor Team.
