Here is a list and description of the offices. Due to the extra responsibility some roles have different age requirements. The primary requirement is to be an enrolled member. Many families have paid membership dues, but have not enrolled or re-enrolled in Zsuites. Please contact me if you have any questions. Here is to the continuation of a great year! President:

Must have a 4-H age of 12 3 years of membership

President: This officer position comes with lots of responsibility and expectations to guide the club in the direction of its goals. Typical responsibilities of a President include creating agendas with the club organizational leader, running meetings while maintaining order and control, delegating tasks, working as a team with other officers, and being enthusiastic about club activities.

Vice-President Must have a 4-H age of 12 3 years of membership The Vice-President runs the meetings in the absence of the President, often serves as the chairperson of committees, helps coordinate educational programs, and works as a team with other officers.

Secretary Must have a 4-H age of 12 3 years of membership The secretary keeps the records for the club. This includes maintaining meeting minutes (record of what was discussed and voted on), keeping track of attendance, organizing the club's correspondence, . The secretary should submit monthly minutes to the club and Extension Office.

The Historian: Must have a 4-H age of 8 current member

The Historian helps to preserve the history of the club. The duties of the historian include keeping record of the club's accomplishments and activities throughout the year, and collecting photographs, news articles and other memorabilia important to the club. After all this information is gathered, it is your job to put it into a scrapbook or other visual way to preserve the memories. You will work closely with the Reporter. Access to a camera, phone, or tablet for photos will be important.

Recreational Leader: Must have a 4-H age of 8 current member

The Recreational Leader must utilize leadership and communication skills to plan and lead games or activities at each meeting.

Reporter: Must have a 4-H age of 8 current member

This position reports information about your club's activities to those outside of your club. This may include writing short articles and taking photos for the local newspaper, 4-H newsletter or Facebook group. You will work with closely with the Historian. Access to a camera, phone, or tablet for photos will be important.

State 4-H Horse Judging Contest

Get ready for fun and friendly competition at the Horse Judging Contest! The primary objective of these contests is to provide an opportunity for youth to demonstrate their knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting where attitudes of friendliness and fairness prevail.

In the State 4-H Horse Judging Contest youth will judge six classes of horses, at least two being halter classes. Youth 14 years of age and older may also choose to participate in oral reasons following the classes. For those not participating in the oral reasons class, one questions class will be required. Top-placing senior division youth will be invited to participate in an invitational judging contest after which the national team will be determined.

For those interested in showing livestock here are some important ownership deadlines. Please reach out to me ASAP so we can arrange for our livestock to be weighed in with another county. You will also be required to take the YQCA certification. There will be limited in person opportunities within our 6 county unit as well as the ability to take it at will online. If you are interested in a livestock project but not sure what to do as far as choosing a project or showing I'm sure we can arrange a clinic.

2024 Livestock Ownership Deadlines

Birth, Ownership and Tattoo Dates for Illinois State Fair Junior Show and county show opportunities.

If you are interested in State Fair, please ask for more specific guidelines.

STEERS & MARKET HEIFERS:

- Calved on or after January 1, 2023
- Owned & personally cared for by exhibitor since February 1, 2024
- Tattooed & Tagged -

o In addition to tattooing, steers that will be going to state fair are to be tagged with the electronic ID tags.

BARROWS:

- Regular Barrows

o Farrowed on or after December 15, 2023 and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2024.

- Premiere Barrows (State Fair)

o Farrowed on or after February 10, 2024 and must have been the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2024

- o Weighed and Tattooed February 10 to April 15, 2024
- o Tattooed within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1.0lbs/day of age
- o Junior exhibitors can purchase nominated barrows

SHEEP WETHERS:

- o Lambed on or after January 1, 2024
- o Ownership Date May 15, 2024
- o Weighed, Tattooed & Tagged between March 15 and May 16, 2024.

- Weigh/Tattoo procedures for Open & Jr. Premiere & Live Show Wethers:

All lambs and meat goats to be exhibited at the State Fair MUST be taken to one of the statewide locations for weighing and tattooing. Each lamb will be tagged with an electronic ID tag, tattooed, weighed, and recorded on Lamb Nomination Forms from Dan Jennings. Specific information regarding each of the weigh-in locations & procedures will be forthcoming.

MEAT GOATS

- Wethers - Born on or after October 1, 2023

- Tattooed in name of exhibitor only by May 15, 2024
- Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk May 15, 2024
