Did you know over 75% of adults have a fear of public speaking to some degree? But not 4-H members! We want to challenge you to learn, explore, and grow in your public speaking this year!

Make plans to give a demonstration, practice your exhibit skills, and work toward qualifying for the State Public Speaking Contest this year.

This is your time to develop skills you'll use for a lifetime!

Members who enroll in the Public Speaking project are encouraged to participate! Not enrolled in this project? You have until March 1 to sign up!

Categories you can compete in:

Formal speech - shares the presenter's own unique view and is intended to motivate, persuade, or inform an audience and may include a call to action. Youth may deliver a speech on any topic they wish.

Illustrated Speech - may be used to inform, persuade, or motivate the audience while using a visual aid. Visual aids may be two-dimensional, three-dimensional, or digital. Youth may include audience participation.

Illustrated speeches may be:

- How-to demonstrations which show the audience how to do something.
- Object lessons which use objects as metaphors to share a message.
- Educational models where drawings or diagrams help explain a topic.

Original works - must be written entirely by the presenter. It may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry. Manuscripts must be sent in advance to the contest. Presentations may be designed for TV, radio, or online media and must be presented live. The types of entries could include:

- Prose and Short Stories
- Poetry/Spoken Word
- Broadcast Media Program
- Theatrical
- Combined Program: Combine any number of the above elements along with other creative presentation forms

Oral Interpretation - presentations must be published works, and manuscripts or transcripts must be submitted prior to the event. They may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry. The types of entries could include:

- Prose and Short Stories
- Poetry
- Theatrical Interpretation
- Published Speech Recitation: Excerpt from a spoken presentation delivered by a public figure, such as Winston Churchill, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., or Maya Angelou
- Combined Program: Combine any number of the above elements along with other creative presentation forms



Illinois Extension Swine Weigh In is Saturday April 13th at the Wayne County Fairgrounds. Please let us know your Weigh-In Information by Wednesday April 10, 2024.

Ownership Dates:

Barrows: Farrowed on or after January 1, 2024 and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2024. Gilts: Age requirement is farrowed on or after January 1,

2024. Owned by exhibitor since June 1, 2024.

Weigh-In Procedures

Market animals (beef, goat, sheep and swine) must be tagged and/or weighed by Extension staff or their designee on the date designated for the specie you are showing. All weigh-ins will be held at the Wayne County Fairgrounds dates will be sent out 1 month in advance. Enter the fairgrounds from the south gate (Main Street) and exit using the north gate (Mt. Vernon Road). If you are not showing a market animal, please notify the extension office prior to the weigh-in so they know your attendance is not required. Notification to the office is required with the number of animals you are weighing or if you are not coming prior to the weigh-in date.

Rate Of Gain Contests

Any 4-H member with a market animal project may enter this class. The Rate of Gain contest is a voluntary class; however, if you choose to compete in the Rate of Gain contest the following requirements must be followed.

Each exhibitor will be allowed to enter the following in the Rate of Gain contest:

Barrow or Market Gilt - may weigh up to 5 animals. A barrow weighing over 85 pounds at initial weigh in will not be eligible to compete in the Rate of Gain contest.

All market animals must be weighed, and weight recorded, by Extension Staff on set dates. the final weigh in will be made on Sunday, July 7, 2024, at the fairgrounds. All market animals in the Rate of Gain contest will be ear tagged or tattooed at the initial weigh in. Weights of the animal will be calculated on average pounds gained per day.

What is Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)?

Illinois 4-H, requires all youth ages 8-18, enrolled in livestock projects
(Beef, Dairy, Goat, Sheep, Swine) to complete annual quality
assurance certification through the Youth for the Quality Care of
Animals (YQCA) program. YQCA is a national multi-species quality
assurance program. The goals of this program are to ensure safety
and wellbeing of animals produced by youth for showing 4-H projects,
ensure a safe food supply to consumers, enhance the future of the
livestock industry by educating youth on these very important issues
so they can become more informed producers and consumers in
agriculture and food industry, and offer livestock shows a valid,
national quality assurance certification for youth livestock
exhibitors.

When do I need to complete YQCA training?
YQCA Training will take place at 4-H Club Meetings. Youth MUST take
this training prior to making their county 4-H show entries. County
deadline is May 1 (Entries will NOT be approved unless training is
complete.) This does not apply to youth exhibiting animal or
veterinary science poster/display projects.

How do I complete the training and what is fee?

Youth have two options to be certified. You may attend a certification program hosted by the Extension Office at your Club Meeting (cost \$3) or you may complete the training online (cost \$12). Each club will be offering an in-person training opportunity.

Youth who choose to attend an in-person instructor-led training will need to register online through the YQCA website. Youth MUST preregister and pay online; no walk-in registrations or money can be taken the day of the training. Youth who do not take the in-person club meeting YQCA training will be required to turn in their certificate to the Extension Office by May 1. If you do not turn in your certificate you will not be able to show in the 2024 Fair.

Dog and Horse Papers

If you plan to lease your animal, your completed lease agreement, with picture of both the right and left sides of the dog or horse must be turned into the extension office by June 1. The Lease Agreement can be downloaded from our website: go.illinois.edu/WayneCounty4-H or picked up at the extension office.

General Projects Show

How does this day work?

Members will be assigned a time for judging that will be released in early July. It is the 4-H members responsibility to pick up their project tags at the extension office the week before the 4-H show. When you show up for the General Project show you will want to show up 10 minutes before your assigned time with your project, entry tag attached to your project and project records in hand.

Off Premise Form

Animals enrolled in the 4-H program are expected to be in the 4-H member's regular care from the animal project starting date until the conclusion of the 4-H show, at the county fair and/or state fair. If animals are housed someplace other than the 4-H member's residence, then an Off-Premise form needs to be on file at the Extension Office by June 1, 2024. The Off-Premise Form can be downloaded from our website: go.illinois.edu/WayneCounty4-H or picked up at the extension office.
