Master Gardeners (MG) have gardening classes planned for the local libraries and garden clubs.

Request for program on canning was made.

Boone County Hunger Coalition continues to work on getting their name out there. Working on getting more people to grow food to share with the local food pantries since there seems to be a shortage of food and an increase in visitors to the centers.

DeKalb County (Connie Handel)

Four Master Gardeners have been working on creating a tree inventory at Oak Crest Retirement Home in DeKalb.

Master Gardeners have been requested to offer programs at the Sycamore, DeKalb, and Hinkley Public Libraries this summer.

The annual DeKalb County Garden Walk is July 13 from 9 am – 3 pm.

Ogle County (Connie Handel)

Bruce is starting a new program series called *Homegrown Healthy* in Oregon. This program is part of the CDC ACTion Grant through the Ogle County Health Department. The Oregon Public Library program will be on Mondays from 5:00-6:00 PM. Starting June 3-Aug. 12 with no class on July 1. Classes will meet rain or shine. You are welcome to bring lawn chairs or a blanket to sit on.

The program will teach participants about growing, harvesting and what to do with it when ready to be eaten. Jan will be teaching nutrition lessons around what is growing in the garden or what can be found at local farmer's markets. The community has been encouraged to register ahead of time so the team can plan accordingly.

Master Gardeners continue to improve upon the seed library located at the Flagg-Rochelle Public Library. They are planning to offer monthly programs at the library.

Master Gardeners are planning to share a table at the Cypress House Outdoor Farmer's Market in Rochelle on the last Saturday of each month (June-August) from 9 am – 1 pm.
