Club Information

State Fair Livestock Entries

Nominations - All sheep and goat nominations for state fair are due by **May 15**. These nomination forms must include pictures of Scrapie tags in the ears of nominated animals. They must also be signed by an Extension 4-H staff member. Nomination forms were emailed to all those registered for sheep or goats in ZSuite. If you need a form, contact your local office.

Horses - Entries for the state horse show are due to Stephanie Hardy at the Illinois State Fair by June 15. Entry forms must be accompanied by ownership/lease/registration papers and color photos of each horse being entered. Entry forms must also be signed by a member of your local 4-H Extension staff. Livestock - Livestock entries are due to the Illinois State Fair by July 1. Entry forms must be signed by a member of the Extension 4-H staff. Entry forms can be found at the Illinois State Fair Website. (*Forms were not yet available at the time of this publication, but the schedule is listed.*)

- You are required to complete **Quality Assurance & Ethics**
- Complete **once** in your 4-H career
- Training is free and found on ZSuite. Log-in to your account and click on the Clover Academy in your dashboard.
- Please complete by May 1.

If you are showing Beef, Dairy, Goats, Sheep, Swine:

- You are required to complete <u>YQCA</u>
- This training is required yearly
