These are due to your local office BEFORE November 1—follow individual county deadlines. If you'd like us to look them over prior to submission, please plan on getting them in at least a week in advance.

#### IL 4-H Scholarships - Due November 1

Open to youth ages 15-18. 5 \$1,000 scholarships available in each of 9 different categories. The categories are: Animal Science, Civic Engagement/Global Living, Creative Arts & Communication, Gardening/Agriculture/Food Access, Healthy Living, Natural Resources & Environmental Science, Personal Growth, and STEM/Robotics.
