ZSUITE REMINDERS

*Do not create a new account when reenrolling.

*There is a new 'parent' option. If you are an adult that is not a screened leader, you can select this option. Parents do not need to put themselves in ZSuite, though.

*Families with more than 3 kids will not be able to pay online until we apply a waiver.

*You must be in ZSuite and have paid the program fee to be considered active.

*Cloverbuds (ages 5-7) must select a Cloverbud club.

*Always select the county of your *Club* NOT your county of residence—even when it asks for your county of residence.

Club Award - Due September 20

Club awards often go unclaimed due to lack of entries. This could be your club's time to get recognized for all the work you put in throughout the year. Return applications to your local office.

County Experience Awards - Due October 1

If you aren't quite ready for the state-level experience award, you can apply for the Bronze, Silver or Gold levels awarded locally. It is the same application, but follow the scoring rubric for the level in which you are applying. The tip sheet will still be helpful.

State Experience Awards - Due November 1

State awards are Diamond or Emerald level. Please use the tip sheet found on our website for help filling out the award application. These are due to your local office BEFORE November 1—follow individual county deadlines. If you'd like us to look them over prior to submission, please plan on getting them in at least a week in advance.

IL 4-H Scholarships - Due November 1

Open to youth ages 15-18. 5 \$1,000 scholarships available in each of 9 different categories. The categories are: Animal Science, Civic Engagement/Global Living, Creative Arts & Communication, Gardening/Agriculture/Food Access, Healthy Living, Natural Resources & Environmental Science, Personal Growth, and STEM/Robotics.
