Public Speaking Contest

How judging will happen is everyone will speak in front of two judges, and we will have an overall placement of 1-5 with awards. Livestock Changes for 2025

Important changes to livestock are being made this year for exhibition at the state and county levels. All beef, dairy, and swine will be required to have a USDA official animal identification number ear tag ("840" tag). The tag must be both visually and electronically capable of reading. Thus, means at check-ins at fair staff/superintendents will be checking tags with an electronic reader.

Some common questions:

Who must have the 840 Tag?

Beef- All Heifers, All Cows, All Steers being exhibited at fair

Dairy- All Heifers, All Cows, All Steers being exhibited at fair

Swine- All Gilts, All Barrows being exhibited at fair

Where do I get the 840 Tag?

Breeder you purchase your animal from

Local Veterinarian

Purchase Tag from a farm supply (Valley Vet, Nasco)

How do I purchase my own tags?

The location of where the animal is being kept will have to have a registered premise ID with the state of Illinois. With the premise ID you will be able to purchase tags from a farm supply store such as Valley Vet or Nasco to name a few.

I do not have a Premise ID how do I get one?

Obtain an application for the Illinois Department of Agriculture and send it in. The turn around time is very fast to get one. (<u>https://agr.illinois.gov</u>) Search for a fillable premise form.

COMMUNICATIONS: PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Enrollment in the Public Presentations project is required to participate in this section. No live animals are allowed in speeches. A 4-H member may advance in one individual category and one team category. *Participating* Youth *must* be 8 years of *age* on or before *September 1, 2024. Participating* youth turning 14 years of age on or before **September 1, 2024 must** enroll as advanced.

Contest Division and Class

Formal Speech | Self-written | Notes Allowed | No props | Individual | 4-5 minutes (Beginner) | 5-6 minutes (Advanced)

Formal Speeches share the presenter's own unique view and are intended to motivate, persuade, or inform an audience and may include a call to action. Youth deliver a speech on any topic they wish.

*This category will be broken down into the following classes by age.

- Beginner: 8-13 years of age
- Advanced: 14 years of and up

Illustrated Speech | Self-written | Notes Allowed | Illustrations Required | Individual 4-5 minutes (Beginner)| 5-6 minutes (Advanced)

Illustrated Speeches may be used to inform, persuade, or motivate the audience while using a visual aid. Visual aids may be two dimensional, three-dimensional, or digital. Youth may include audience participation. Digital visual aids must be stored on a USB flash drive. Illustrated speeches may be:

- How-to demonstrations which show the audience how to do something.
- Object lessons which use objects as metaphors to share a message.
- Educational models where drawings or diagrams help explain a topic.
- Beginner: 8-13 years of age
- Advanced: 14 years of and up

Original Works | Self-written | Notes Allowed | Props and Costumes Allowed | Individual or 2-Person Team | Youth must provide printed manuscripts to judge | 4-6 minutes

Original works must be written entirely by the presenter. It may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry. Manuscripts or transcripts must be submitted to the Judge on the day of the presentation. Presentations may be designed for TV, radio, or online media and must be presented live. The types of entries could include:

- Prose and Short Stories
- Poetry/ Spoken Word
- Broadcast Media Program
- Theatrical
- Combined Program: Combine any number of the above elements along with other creative presentation forms

Oral Interpretation | Published Work | Props and Costumes Allowed | Individual or 2-Person Team | Youth must provide printed manuscripts to judge | 4-6 minutes

Presentations in Oral Interpretation must be published works, and manuscripts or transcripts must be submitted to the Judge on the day of presentation. They may be presented as an individual or a two-person team entry. The types of entries could include:

- Prose and Short Stories
- Poetry
- Theatrical Interpretation

• Published Speech Recitation: Excerpt from a spoken presentation delivered by a public figure, such as Winston Churchill, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., or Maya Angelou

Animal Livestock Dates

Ownership dates for animals is as follows:

All market barrows, goats, wethers and ewe lambs must be in member's possession at least 60 days prior to show. Market goats will need to be between 4-8 months old at the time of the show. Gilts and all swine breeding stock and beef or dairy yearling heifers must be in the member's possession by April 1. Bucket Calves must be born between February 1 and April 1. They must be in member's possession within 2 weeks of birth and must be at least 90 days old when shown. Steers must be in members possession by January 1.

<u>The above dates are when all 4-H'ers</u> with these projects must have the animals in their possession.
