4-H ZSuites Enrollment open until March 3

Have you enrolled in ZSuites? If you said no, the clock is ticking! March 3 is the deadline to enroll in order to exhibit at the Shelby County 4-H & Junior Fair.

Families will be responsible for paying \$10 of the \$20 program fee for 2024-2025. Shelby Extension Foundation will be paying the other \$10. Families will be able to pay the program fee online via a credit card or with cash or check to their club leader or the Shelby County Extension Office. Please note - there are a few clubs that are paying their member's program fees so please check with your club leader regarding payment status.

If your family is enrolling more than 3 children, you may submit your enrollment but do not pay online. The 4th child discount will need to be applied before payment can be made. Once the discount has been applied, Yolanda will notify you for payment. Refunds cannot be issued if you pay for more than three children.

Members must be enrolled and approved in ZSuites before participating in any county event including Shooting Sports, parades, workshops, etc. Contact Yolanda with any questions at nation2@illinois.edu or by calling 217-774-9546.

4-H Steer and Market heifer weigh-in

Saturday, February 8

Mark your calendar for steer (dairy & beef) and market heifer weigh-in to be held on Saturday, February 8, 2025 from 8-10 a.m. at the United Producers Sale Barn in Shelbyville.

If needed, the snow date is February 15. If the weather is questionable, watch for an email. Information will also be shared on the Shelby County IL 4-H Facebook page. ALL market steers going to the 2025 Illinois State Fair will be electronically tagged during weigh-in.

4-H'ers must be enrolled in ZSuites and have paid their program fee in order to weigh steers or market heifers. Contact Yolanda if you will be attending by Tuesday, February 4 so appropriate paperwork can be prepared.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

All 4-H members enrolled in beef, dairy cattle, goats, swine and sheep are required to take the YQCA training. This training is required to be taken each year. In-person training is \$3 and the On-line training is \$12. Shelby County 4-H is offering 4 in-person training sessions. The training is set up to be completed in approximately one hour. All training sessions will be held at the 4-H Center in Shelbyville. Don't wait to get signed up, class size is limited!

Families will need to register at the YQCA website, sign up for which training they would like to attend and pay the registration fee. *Youth will need to complete the Pre-Test before attending the training.* Youth will need to complete the Post-Test before printing the certificate.

Online ethics certification required for cats, dogs, horses, rabbits and poultry

Deadline - Monday, June 2

First time animal exhibitors enrolled in cats, dogs, horses, rabbits and poultry need to complete QAEC. This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits.

Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification is a one time training for youth exhibiting projects in the following: cats, dogs, horses, poultry, and rabbits. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. Members who don't complete the certification by June 2 will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show.

Shelby County 4-H Archery

Monday, April 7

The Spring Archery session will kick off on Monday, April 7 and run for seven weeks, ending on Monday, May 19. Classes will be held from 6:30-8 p.m. at the 4-H Center. At the beginning session, instructors will create times for future sessions.

There will be a \$20 archery fee for members who participated in the Archery program in the fall. There will be a \$10 admin fee and \$20 archery fee for new members participating for the first time. Youth not currently enrolled in Shelby County 4-H will need to enroll in ZSuites and pay the \$10 program fee before participating.

Youth will not be allowed to shoot if they are not enrolled and have not paid their fees. There are a select number of bows available and members may bring their own bow but will be subject to a safety check by instructors.
