

2025 Livestock Ownership Deadlines

Birth, Ownership and Tattoo Dates for Illinois State Fair Junior Show and White County. If you are interested in State Fair, please ask for more specific guidelines.

STEERS & MARKET HEIFERS:

- Calved on or after January 1, 2024
- Owned & personally cared for by exhibitor since February 1, 2025
- Tattooed & Tagged -
- o On or between the last Saturday in January (January 27, 2025) and February 29, 2025.

Beef weigh-in is February 1. (All Male & Females will be weighed and/or tagged)

o In addition to tattooing, steers that will be going to state fair are to be tagged with the electronic ID tags.

BARROWS:

- Regular Barrows

o Farrowed on or after December 15, 2024 (White County Livestock Show Only) and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2025.

Swine weigh-in is March 22 @ 8am @ the Fairgrounds

(All Male & Females will be weighed and/or tagged)

- Premiere Barrows

o **Farrowed on or after February 10, 2025** and must have been the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2025 o Weighed and Tattooed February 10 to April 15, 2025

o Tattooed within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1.0lbs/day of age

o Junior exhibitors can purchase nominated barrows

SHEEP WETHERS:

- Both Premiere & Live Show Wethers

o Lambed on or after January 1, 2025

o Ownership Date – May 15, 2025

o Weighed, Tattooed & Tagged – between March 15 and May 15, 2025.

Sheep & Goat weigh-in is May 3 @ 8:00am @ Fairgrounds.

(All Male & Females will be weighed and/or tagged)

- Weigh/Tattoo procedures for Open & Jr. Premiere & Live Show Wethers:

All lambs and meat goats to be exhibited at the State Fair MUST be taken to one of the statewide locations for weighing and tattooing. Each lamb will be tagged with an electronic ID tag, tattooed, weighed, and recorded on Lamb Nomination Forms from Dan Jennings.

Specific information regarding each of the weigh-in locations & procedures will be forthcoming.

MEAT GOATS

- Wethers Born on or after October 1, 2024
- Tattooed in name of exhibitor only by May 15, 2025
- Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk May 15, 2025

<u>Reminder to Large Livestock Families</u>

Large Livestock families,

We wanted to give you a heads up and plenty of time to prepare for this new requirement for cattle and swine. (I've included sheep and goat families just in case) Beginning in 2025, individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Producers can order tags directly, including through the free tag program with the Department, or utilize their veterinarians. The Department has tried to provide producers with ample time to prepare by pushing the notice out more than a year in advance and offering the free tag program, for which we have partnered with organizations to have on site distribution events. Here is a link to the information on ordering tags through the department of both producers and veterinarians: <u>Animal Disease Traceability</u> (illinois.gov).

<u>https://agr.illinois.gov/animals/animalhealth/fair-exhibition-requirements.html</u> The second link is 2024 County Fair Health Requirements. If you open it, changes for 2025 are in red. The big thing is cattle and swine must have 840 tags. **If you are producing your own on your farm, to get 840 tags, you have to get premise id.** Calves under 6 months do not require a CVI. Depending on your 4-H show date, early January calves could be required on the CVI.

So in short, if you raise and produce your own stock then you will need to get a premise id and order 840 tags for your cattle and swine herd. This will need to be done before the 2025 weigh ins (Cattle Feb. 1, Swine Mar. 22, Sheep/Goat May 3). If you purchase your livestock from someone else you will need to make sure they have registered 840 tags already tagged or you will need to do this with yours before weigh in. This is MANDATORY by the state so if not done then you will not be allowed to show at the 2025 White County 4-H Livestock Show!

4-H Project Grants Available

The White County Farm Bureau is pleased to sponsor the 2025 4-H Project Grant Program for White County 4-Hers.

The program is designed to encourage young 4-Hers to begin new projects by eliminating potential cost burdens they may have; as well as encourage new individuals to become active in the White County 4-H program.

4-Hers ages 8-14 are eligible to apply. Applications must be completed by the 4-Her and signed off by a parent/guardian and the 4-H Club Leader. Applications are due March 1, 2025.

Online ethics certification required for everyone taking 4-H animal projects.

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance and Ethics course** one time in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area. The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: cats, dogs, horses, poultry, and rabbits. Members who do not complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. The local office has a list of those already certified. The website is located online at: http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/.

This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits. White County deadline will be June 1! Get it done now, it's not hard!
